

FACTS TO REMEMBER.

Alabama contains 52,250 square miles, was settled in 1711, and was admitted into the Union December 14th, 1819.

Arkansas contains 53,850 square miles, was settled in 1685, and was admitted into the Union June 15th, 1836.

California contains 158,360 square miles, was settled in 1768 at San Diego, and was admitted into the Union September 9, 1850.

Colorado contains 103,925 square miles, was settled in 1850, and was admitted into the Union August 1st, 1876.

Connecticut contains 4,990 square miles, was settled in 1633 at Windsor, and was admitted into the Union January 9th, 1788.

Delaware contains 2,050 square miles, was settled in 1638 at Wilmington, and was admitted into the Union December 7th, 1787.

Florida contains 58,680 square miles, was settled in 1565 at St. Augustine, and was admitted into the Union March 3rd, 1845.

Georgia contains 59,475 square miles and was settled in 1733 by James Oglethorpe. Became one of the United States by adoption of the constitution January 2nd, 1788.

Illinois contains 56,650 square miles, was settled by the French in 1683, and was admitted into the Union December 3rd, 1818.

Indiana contains 36,350 square miles, was settled in 1690 at Vincennes, and was admitted into the Union December 11th, 1816.

Iowa contains 56,025 square miles, was settled in 1833, and was admitted into the Union December 28, 1846.

Kansas contains 82,080 square miles, was settled in 1827 at Fort Leavenworth, and was admitted into the Union January 29th, 1861.

Kentucky contains 40,400 square miles, was settled in 1770 at Boonesboro, and was admitted into the Union June 1st, 1792.

Louisiana contains 48,720 square miles, was settled by the French in 1699, and was admitted into the Union April 8th, 1812.

Maine contains 33,040 square miles, was settled in 1630, and was admitted into the Union March 5th, 1820.

Maryland contains 12,210 square miles, was settled in 1634, and became one of the states of the Union by adoption of the constitution of the U. S. April 28th, 1788.

Massachusetts contains 8,315 square miles, was settled in 1620 at Plymouth, and was admitted into the Union February 6th, 1788.

Michigan contains 58,915 square miles, was settled in 1670 and admitted into the Union January 26th, 1837.

Minnesota contains 83,365 square miles, was settled in 1846, and admitted into the Union May 11th, 1858.

Mississippi contains 46,810 square miles, was settled in 1716 at Natchez, and was admitted into the Union December 10th, 1817.

Missouri contains 69,415 square miles, was settled in 1755, and admitted into the Union August 10th, 1821.

Nebraska contains 76,855 square miles, was settled in 1854, and admitted into the Union March 1st, 1867.

Nevada contains 110,700 square miles, was settled in 1848, and admitted into the Union October 31st, 1864.

New Hampshire contains 9,305 square miles, was settled in 1624 at Little Harbor, and was admitted into the Union June 21st, 1788.

New Jersey contains 7,815 square miles, was settled in 1620 at Elizabeth, and was admitted into the Union December 18th, 1787.

New York contains 49,170 square miles, was settled in 1614 at New York City, and was admitted into the Union July 26th, 1788.

North Carolina contains 52,250 square miles, was settled in 1650 at Chowan river, and was admitted into the Union November 21st, 1789.

Ohio contains 41,060 square miles, was settled in 1788, and admitted into the Union November 29th, 1802.

Oregon contains 96,030 square miles, was settled in 1811, and admitted into the Union February 14th, 1859.

Pennsylvania contains 45,215 square miles, was settled in 1643 at Philadelphia, and was admitted into the Union December 12th, 1787.

Rhode Island contains 1,250 square miles was settled in 1636 at Providence, and was admitted into the Union May 29th, 1790.

South Carolina contains 30,570 square miles, was settled in 1670 at Ashley river, and was admitted into the Union May 23rd, 1788.

Tennessee contains 42,050 square miles, was settled in 1757 at Port London, and was admitted into the Union June 1st, 1796.

Texas contains 265,780 square miles, was settled in 1692 at San Antonio, and was admitted into the Union December 29th, 1845.

Vermont contains 9,565 square miles, was settled in 1725 at Fort Dummer, and was admitted into the Union March 4th, 1791.

Virginia contains 42,450 square miles, was settled in 1607 at Jamestown, and was admitted into the Union June 20th, 1788.

West Virginia contains 24,780 square miles and was made a state June 20, 1863, by carving its present territory out of Virginia of which up to that time it had been a part.

Wisconsin contains 56,040 square miles; was settled in 1669 at Green Bay, and was admitted into the Union May 29th, 1848.
