TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

The Eclipse in Cal.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 1.—Professor Lew-
is Swift, director of the Warner observatory,
of Rochester, N. Y., was stationed at Nel-
son, Cal., and telegraphed the following to
the *Examiner* as the result of his observa-
tion: "The eclipse, so far as inferring an
opportunity to search for intramercu-
rial planets, was a failure from clouds and haze.
All four contacts were well made, a chro-
nometer watch, previously set to the Lick
observatory time, being used. Five very
small colorless protuberances were seen, all
have pointed apexes. Near the point of
one was another, detached from the sun.
Bailey's beads were seen at the second and
third contacts, but entirely unlike those
seen at Denver in 1878. No chromes
were visible, though looked for. Mercury,
Venus, Vega and Alpha Cygni were seen.
The corona could not be drawn, but as seen
through the telescope was not very exten-
sive."

A Curious Present.

NEW YORK, Jan. 1.—Adam Forepaugh, the
showman, has offered to give his elephant Tip
as a New Year's present to the city of New
York. The offer was accepted, and the animal
will reach Central Park to-morrow. He is eigh-
teen years old, ten feet high weighs five tons,
and is valued at \$8000.

Dueling Yet.

ATLANTA, Ga., Jan. 1.—A report has reach-
ed here of a bloody fight eighteen miles from the
city, on Saturday, in which all four participants
were badly wounded. Louis Black and a man
named Brown were hunting on the land of Sam
Fielding, when he and his son appeared with
guns and a battle ensued. All are still living.

Gamblers Arrested.

TACOMA, Jan. 1.—The police last night raid-
ed the Fashion, Monogram and Cabinet saloons,
and arrested eight poker players, among the
rest the well-known gambler "Stud" Williams.
All were brought before Justice Lawrence and
fined \$20 and \$7 costs.

The Haytian Rebellion.

NEW YORK, Jan. 1.—The *Sun* says of Hay-
tian affairs, that Hippolyte's friends in New
York received advices by the steamer Clyde
that Hippolyte has been elected president by a
majority of the representatives of the constitu-
ent assembly, and will soon appeal anew for
recognition.

Speaking of the battles which have been
fought, advices say that there was only one of
any consequence, and that was at St. Marie.
The attempt to take this place cost Legitime
dearly. It is a natural stronghold, a sort of
Thermopylae. Legitime's forces made a des-
perate attempt to take it, and lost 1300 men,
killed and wounded. Then they withdrew to
the south, and have not made an aggressive
move since.

A Remarkable Occurrence.

CLEVELAND, Jan. 1.—Andrew Squires, the
Cleveland lawyer who went to London to secure
\$160,000 which Thomas Arworthing, Cleveland's
defaulting treasurer, has deposited in bank
there, returned to-day with the money. Ar-
worthing is now on the ocean, enroute to Canada
where he will remain until he can enter the
United States without fear of arrest.
