TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

The Eclipse in Cal.

San Francisco, Jan. 1 .- Professor Lewis Swift, director of the Warner observatory, of Rochester, N. Y., was stationed at Nelson, Cal., and telegraphed the following to the Examiner as the result of his observation: "The eclipses of ar as affording an epportunity to search for intramercurial planets, was a fallure from clouds and haze. All four contacts were well made, a chronometer watch, previously set to the Lick observatory time, being used. Five very small colorless protuberances were seen, all have pointed apexes. Near the point of one was another, detached from the sun. Bailey's beads were seen at the second and third contacts, but entirely unlike those seen at Denven in 1878. No chromes were visible, though looked for. Mercury, Venus, Vega and Alpha Cygna were seen. The corona could not be drawn, but as seen through the telescope was not very extensive." of Rochester, N.
