TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

It Will be Dramatic

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 6.—The revival of interest in the identity of Murchison of Pomona by the connection of Governor Sheldon's name therewith has caused those holding the secret to relax a little, and it is now intimated that Murchison's real name will be given with dramatic effect on March 4 next. Murchison is to go on to Washington, take part in the inaugural ceremonies as Murchison, and then he will be introduced to President Harrison under his proper name.

Plenty of Laborers.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 6.—Speaking on the agitation of the question of the alleged scarcity of laborers in California, Ex-Governor Perkins says: "The question is very clear to me. There is enough white help in this state at all times to supply all demands. If the men who are clamoring for more Chinese knew how to treat white men their work would be better done and the general result more satisfactory. I can go out to-day and get 1000 men, men who are able and willing to work."

Come to Oregon.

FARGO, Dak., Jan. 6.—News comes here of a pitiable state of affairs among the Norwegian farmers of Walsh county. It is said there are about fifty families almost destitute. The only means of subsistence they have or have had for some time is cooking their green frozen wheat into a sort of porridge. The live within the belt where early frosts did the greatest damage and had relied solely on this season's crop to tide them over the winter, but this calamity left them with absolutely nothing.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.—James Lotan, of Portland, Oregon, is in the city on a short visit and gave a dinner party at the Ebbitt on Friday evening to Senator Mitchell and a number of friends.

Moody in S. F.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 6.—Dwight L. Moody the evangelist, to-day began a series of meetings in this city. Three services were held, two of them being in the Mechanics pavilion, a large area of which had been enclosed especially for this purpose. The seating capacity of this improvised tabernacle is 6000, and during both the afternoon and evening meetings, not only was every seat filled, but also the aisles, while hundreds were turned away.

Hunt Talks.

WALLA WALLA, W. T., Jan. 5.—At a mass meeting this afternoon J. W. Hunt spoke. He said he had not built the O. & W. T. to sell out; that his system was independent of all other roads, and that he intended to keep it that way. He had a fifty-year traffic agreement with the Northern Pacific, and therefore was absolutely indifferent to combinations and joint leases of other companies. He had made this city the center of his system and would build a depot that would be a credit to this or any other city, and pay for half the necessary depot grounds. He had established his headquarters in this city, purchased a home here and was expecting to reside here henceforth.

A Careless Boy.

MARYSVILLE, Jan. 5.—At Yuba City this afternoon a boy named Wallace picked up a shotgun from where he left it, and threw it over his shoulder without noticing that it was cocked. The gun was discharged, the load entering the breast of a boy named Groenig, near by, inflicting a wound from which the latter died twenty minutes later.
