TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

A Royal Scare.

MADRID, Jan. 8.—An attempt to blow up the Royal place was made here to-day. No one was injured, and the only damage done was the smashing of windows. The petard with which the attempt was made was exploded on the staircase of the palace. Great excitement prevailed for a time, the members of the royal household being almost panic-stricken. Prime Minister Sagasta, as soon as he heard of the attempted outrage, hurried from congress to the palace, where he at once was admitted to an audience with the queen.

A Modest Claim.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Jan. 8.—F. C. Patterson, of Portland Or., claims that nearly all the land were the town of Stratford now stands, belongs to the heirs of Hezekiah Patterson, who died in 1760. Patterson, it is claimed, left the property to his wife on condition that if she married again it should go to the children. Mrs. Patterson married and disposed of the children by binding them out. An attorney is looking up the matter.

A Nice Young Man.

CINCINNATI, Jan. 8.—The Keefe Milling Company failed yesterday. It now transpires that during December Keefe, jr., secretary of the firm, forged drafts to the amount of \$46,000 on which he realized at the banks. The young man is missing.

Left Forty Children.

OGDEN, Jan. 8.—One of Israel's patriarchs has gone to the valley of Jehosaphat. He is Abraham Hunsaker, an ancient Mormon of long years standing, who, in the course of his checkered career as a Saint of the Latter Day's married five women, from whom he had, at the time of his death, forty living children, of whom twenty-six married ones had blessings of aggregate offspring of 130, making 170 live twigs on that one patriarchal tree.

The Panama Canal.

LONDON, Jan. 8.—A Paris dispatch to the *Standard* says: The Panama canal difficulty has been temporarily averted, all the contractors having consented to receive shares in the Panama railway as a guarantee for sums becoming due them in the immediate future. The shares of the new company will be reserved exclusively for the present stockholders.

A Brutal Murder.

CARSON, Nev., Jan. 8.—Yesterday morning two young men named Deloras Coronado and Ed Pixley had a friendly set-to with bare knuckles for \$150 the winner to treat the crowd, Pixley struck Coronado in the stomach, which caused his death a few hours after. Pixley is in jail.

Vesuvius Angry.

NAPLES, Jan. 8.—Vesuvius is showing increased activity. A new cone which has formed has been opened. A landslide has occurred at Posillipo. A mass of rock and earth 50,000 cubic yards in extent fell upon the houses below, killing one man and several animals.
