## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Terrific Cyclone.

PITTSBURG, Jan. 9.—A terrific storm of wind and hail, the worst known for years, swept over the city shortly after noon to-day, carrying with it death and destruction. The storm formed with a suddenness that was overwhelming, and as the wind, accompanied by hail and torrents of rain, swept along the streets, pedestrians were hurled before it and barely escaped being crushed under vehicles passing along the thoroughfares. Buildings were torn up, and eight persons were killed.

READING, Pa., Jan. 9.—This is the saddest night in the history of Reading. A deathlike pale hangs upon the city, the result of the most horrible disaster in its history. A hundred households are in mourning as a result of one of the greatest calamities known in Pennsylvania. A cyclone swept afternoon, and laid waste everything within its reach, and with terrible loss of life, about 100 persons being killed.

Quicker Than Usual Way.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 9.—An unknown man drank himself to death in a Sacramento street grocery last night. He entered the place, and without any apparent bravado deliberately set to work to drink every thing in the house. He drank half a dozen bottles of various kinds of wine, and then tackled whisky, and finally wound up with six glasses of beer. Another glass was ordered and furnished, but before he could raise it to his lips he fell to the floor insensible.

Fast Skating.

AMSTERDAM, Jan. 9.—In the skating contest for the amateur championship of the world Von Paulshin, the Russian champion, won, today, the one-mile race in 2:58 1/2. John Donoghue, America's representative, made a mile in 3:00 1/2.

Assassinated.

BOMBAY, Jan. 9.—Advices have been received from Afghanistan, to the effect that during a parade of troops at Makaricharif on December 2 a sepoy of the infantry fired at the ameer but missed him. He was executed on the spot.

A Brutal Pastor.

CHICAGO, Jan. 9.—Rev. Father Pyplatz, of the Polish church here, is charge with extreme cruelty to his parishioners. An unmarried member of his church recently became a mother. To expiate this offense, on her arrival at church her hands were bound behind her. She was then wound from head to foot in crapes, and laid face downward on the floor. Some boys stood beside her, and as each person came into the church they called attention to the culprit by shouting, "Pray for the penitent!" This humiliating position was maintained from 8 A. M. till 12 A. M. Pyplatz will probably be removed from the parish.

Grand Larceny.

NEW YORK, Jan. 9.—The prohibition organ the Voice publishes a confession of the employe who stole the mailing list of the paper during presidential campaign; also that of his accomplice, who was the principal agent, and who sold it to the republican party, through Quay and Clarkson, who paid \$250 for it. The publishers of the Voice declare their intention of prosecuting Quay, Clarkson and Dudley, of the republican national committee, for alleged buying of the Voice's stolen mailing list, knowing it was stolen property.
