TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

The Cyclone.

READING, Penn., Jan. 10.—There is mourning and sorrow in many households in Reading to-day. The pall of death hangs over the city. Fathers, mothers, brothers, sisters, relatives and friends are grief-stricken over the wreck of last night. Over one hundred spirits are hushed forever in death, as the result of the wreck and run wrought in this city in darkness, which was relieved subsequently by electric lights and huge bonfires, which shed a lurid glare on the scene of death.

Even on Skates

AMSTERDAM, Jan. 10.—In the skating championship contest here to-day the two-mile race was won by Joseph Donoghue, of Newburgh N. Y., in six minutes and twenty-four seconds. Panschin, the Russian champion, covered the distance in six minutes and thirty-one seconds. The best record previously made for the same distance was six minutes and forty-two seconds.

Pendleton Awakening.

PENDELTON, Or., Jan. 10.—An adjourned meeting of citizens to consider the raising of a subsidy and granting a right of way to the Hunt railroad was held last night and largely attended. The committee appointed to confer with Mr. Hunt regarding the route he desired to enter the city, reported having met him strongly in favor of having the road pass through Alta street, as other routes presented many engineering difficulties and great expense. In view of the fact of opposition on the part of some of the citizens of Pendleton to the road coming through Alta street, he would send a party of locating engineers to survey the other routes proposed. Over \$5000 was pledged by those attending the meeting toward the subsidy unconditionally, and it will be no trouble to raise the full amount required when final disposition of the proposed route is made. Pendleton realizes it must have the road.

Slightly Above Par.

NEW YORK, Jan. 10.—Twenty shares of Chemical bank stock were sold by auction at executor's sale, on the real estate exchange yesterday, to David Wolfe Bishop, a relative of the late Catherine Wolfe, who was the richest woman in the country, at \$4195 a share, the highest price ever paid for this stock. The par value is \$100 and there are but 3000 shares in all. The bank declares bi-monthly dividends of 25 per cent. The largest individual holder of stock is Adele de Talleyrand Perigord, Duchess de Deno formerly Mrs. Stevens. She holds 300 shares, which are worth \$1,259,500.

Prohibitory Amendment.

CONCORD, N. H., Jan. 10.—The constitutional convention to-day adopted an amendment to the Constitution, prohibiting the manufacture and sale of all intoxicating liquors, "except cider."

A 25 Year Franchise.

NORTH YAKIMA, W. T., Jan. 10.—The city council at a special meeting to-night granted a franchise to George F. Woolston, of Boston, to erect a system of water works to cost about \$100,000. The franchise is to last for 25 years. The council also granted a franchise to Messrs. Thomas Howlett and Esheiman to erect an electric light plant in the city to be in operation by May 1.
