Now that the Legislature is in session it would be well for its members to bear in mind that there are some things that should be done and some that should not be done. The mortgage tax law should not be repealed. The state should not buy the locks at Oregon City. The people should protest against sending J. N. Dorph to the U. S. Senate again, as he has fully identified himself with railroad and other monopolies. I do not believe the assessment law is just right. Let it be amended so as to permit indebtedness to the amount of \$2000 to be deducted from each taxpayers assessment and no more. This would to a large extent do away with the very prevalent practice of creating temporary indebtedness to meet the Assessor with.

A curious story is related from Madrid in explanation of the misfortunes which have lately afflicted the royal house of Spain. It appears that the root of the mischief is a fatal ring of quite medieval deadliness. The late King Alphonso XII gave it to his cousin Mercedes when he was betrothed to her, and she wore it during the whole of her short married life. On her death the King presented it to his grandmother, the Queen Christina. She died very soon after, when it passed to the King's sister, the Infanta del Pilar, who at once began to sicken and in a few days breathed her last. Alphonso then handed it to his sister-in-law, Christina, the youngest daughter of the Duke of Montpensier, but in three months she was also dead. His Majesty now resolved to retain the baleful jewel in his own keeping, but he, too, soon fell a victim to its mysterious malignancy. By order of his widow it has now been suspended by a chain around the neck of the statue of the Maid of Almudena, the patron saint of Madrid.

## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Cabinet Making.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 11.—A prominent member of the house solves the cabinet problem as follows: Blaine will be offered the state portfolio; Allison will be earnestly urged by General Harrison to take the treasury and Wamamaker will go into the cabinet. The Pacific coast may be given the interior department, and the man will probably be John F. Swift.

Canada Doesn't Want Them.

OTTAWA, Ont., Jan. 11.—A member of the government stated to-night with reference to the application to reduce the tax on Chinamen to facilitate the emigration of Chinamen from the United States to Canada and Australia, that the ministers were disposed to make no change whatever in the direction desired, but on the contrary, that it is their disposition, if any modification is made at all, to maintain the policy of discouraging the immigration of Chinese into Canada, except under bond and a heavy per capita tax.

Smuggling.

PORT TOWNSEND, Jan. 11.—The largest opium and Chinese seizure made on Puget Sound in several months was made last night, when nearly \$5000 worth of opium and twelve Chinese were captured in the British sloop Emerald, near the mouth of Port Discovery bay, the vessel being in charge of Benjamin Lindy, master and Frank Hall. The sloop was loaded with 400 pounds of refined opium and a dozen Chinese, from Victoria, and the master was to receive \$20 for each Chinaman landed on \$2000 on the opium. All of the Chinese were provided with British certificates, entitling them to return to Victoria.

Northwestern Notes.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 11.—A postoffice has been established at Columbiaville, Columbia county, Or., and John A. Walsh appointed postmaster.

Issac D. Miller has been appointed postmaster at Miller's Linn County, Or., in place of C. D. Van Dyke, who has resigned.

A pension has been granted Godfrey Cooning, of Washington territory.

On motion of Senator Dorph N. D. Simon, of Portland Or., has been admitted to practice before the supreme court.

A Boat Race.

TORONTO, Jan. 11.—Wm. O'Connor has accepted Gaudaur's challenge to row three miles for \$1000 a side, at San Francisco, about March 1.

Not a Failure.

SPOKANE FALLS, W. T., Jan. 11.—Spokane Falls has 500 business houses, and not a single failure was recorded during the past year. "My records are clear on that score," said Sheriff Glispin to a Review reporter to-day. No other city or county in the whole United States can make a better showing, and I doubt if one can equal it."

Robbed.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 11.—John Weiss, a German, aged 31 years, is at the receiving hospital deploring the loss of \$3200. He claims to have been sandbagged and robbed at 3 o'clock this morning by two men on Broadway, near Sansome street.
