A Booming Town.

ELLENSBURG, Jan. 12 .- Continued mild weather has enabled builders to prosecute work weather has enabled huilders to prosecute work into midwinter, and there is no cessation of building or outdoor work. Three planiny mills in the city are now running constantly to supply orders ahead for spring and summer work, and the sawmills of Puget sound are receiving large orders from Ellensburg. Vesterday one con-tractor made arrangement for two car loads of lumber a day for six months. This is independ-ent of the lumber supply by local mills.

TOPEKA, Jan. 12.-Governor Martin received a dispatch this afternoon from the mayor of Cimarron, stating that a force of men from In-Cimarron, stating that a force of men from In-galls, in the same county, had attempted to re-move by force the records of the county from Cimarron to the temporary county seat, and that a fight occurred in which several men were killed.
