The Hunt R R.

WALLA WALLA, W. T., Jan. 14.—A corps of O. & W. T. engineers who for some time have been surveying along Alpowa ridge beyond Dayton and in the direction of Lewiston, returned here this morning, to remain during the cold weather. That the O. & W. T. will get to Lewiston is almost an assured fact. Mr. Hunt has arranged to meet the citizens of Milton and Weston, and the farmers in the region about those places shortly, in the interest of the extension of his system to these towns, which will probably happen the coming summer, as representative citizens have already guaranteed the subsidy required.

A Fearful R. R. Collision.

YOUNGTOWN, Ohio, Jan. 14.—A passenger train for New York on the New York Pennsylvania & Ohio railroad, running fifty miles an hour, this morning struck a freight train, head end, near Talmadge, Ohio. Both engineers, both fireman and eight passengers were killed and fourteen passengers badly injured. The freight train was attempting to make a siding and had sent out a flagman who failed to signal the passenger.

A Test Case.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 14.—The supreme court to-day granted a motion to advance for hearing the case of Che Chae Ping against the United States, and assigned it for argument the second Monday in March. This is the case brought to test the constitutionality of the Scott Chinese exclusion act declares void return certificates granted Chinamen who left the United States prior to the passage of the act.

VICKSBURG, Jan. 14.—Jefferson Davis arrived here last evening. To-night, in response to a serenade, Davis feelingly referred to the Mississippi boys, whom he said he had lived and suffered for. He closed as follows: "It is probably the last time I will see you, but I shall die, when I do die, with the thought and feeling that I have not lived in vain, and with a love for Mississippi that passeth all understanding."

Wagon Grants.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 14.—The house committee on public lands has ordered a report upon the bill to recover land granted to aid the construction of wagon roads in Oregon. The measure, commonly known as the Dolph bill, proposes that a direct suit be brought in Oregon by the government against the derelict corporations to recover such lands as are coterminous with parts of wagon roads not constructed in accordance with the requirements of the granting acts.
