Death plays a part in politics that no wise man leaves out of his estimate of the near future. The Democrats of Pennsylvania nominated Judge McCollum for the single vacancy which had to be filled on the Supreme Bench of that State. His sole certainty was defeat by about 60,000 majority. But before election day one of the Justices of the Supreme Court died, leaving a second vacancy to be filled, and the constitution requires that where two vacancies have to be filled on that bench at the same election, each voter can vote for only one candidate. This insured Judge McCollum's election and he steps into a twenty-year term of an honorable office with \$8,500 a year salary.

BOSTON, Jan. 17.—It is the old story. John L. Sullivan, once without a peer in the fistic arena, has again met his old conqueror, rum, and has become groggy. NEW YORK, Jan. 17.—Arrangements have been completed for the transportation of Mary Anderson and her company from Boston to San Francisco in April. Miss Anderson will close her American tour in San Francisco.

Missionaries Murdered.

ZANZIBAR, Jan. 17.—The Arabs have destroyed the German missionary station at Tugu, fifteen miles west of Dar-el-Salem. A majority of the slaves captured by the German man-of-war Leipzig were lodged at the station. One missionary escaped and eight were massacred. Three bodies, one a woman, were found mutilated barbarously. The Arabs carried off the servants and slaves. The French missionary stations near Tugu are in imminent danger.

Discharged.

ALBANY, N. Y., Jan. 17.—In the United States district court today Ephraim Gardner, charged with smuggling opium across the Canadian border at Cape Vincent and Ogdensburg, was discharged and the case was laid over to the March term. Bail was fixed at \$1000.

Slighted.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17.—Some comment was caused recently by the fact that Senator Ingalls, president pro tem of the senate, was not asked to be present at the state dinner given by President and Mrs. Cleveland last week.

For Oregon and Washington.

BUFFALO, Jan. 17.—One of the cars of the United States fish commission, in charge of Captain Frank Ellis, has passed through here, having on board 1710 lobsters for points on the coast of Oregon and Washington. The car will also receive 5,000,000 white fish spawn from the hatchery at Northville, Mich., half of which will be put in at about the mouth of the Columbia river and the other half in Puget Sound. The trip is merely an experimental one.

Only Bills.

SACRAMENTO, Jan. 17.—Practically nothing has yet been done in the legislature, except to appoint attaches and introduce bills. About 500 bills have been introduced up to this time, and the state printer is engaged in placing them in a readable form at the rate of forty or fifty per day.
