## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

### A Sensation.

ST. PAUL, Minn., Jan. 18.—A sensation was created in the state senate this morning when Senator Ward, who championed the cause of United States Senator Sabin in the republican caucus last night, introduced a resolution for the appointment of a committee to investigate the charges of bribery in the senatorial fight.

### Small Pox.

DENVER, Col., Jan. 18.—The report published in the East that people are fleeing from this city because of a smallpox epidemic and that there are now from 700 to 800 cases, is false. From forty to fifty cases have been reported at the health office up to date, which is not greater than usual at this season year. The cases are very mild, and there have been only three deaths so far.

### A Jail on Fire.

EUGENE CITY, Jan. 18.—A fire broke out in the roof of the jail last night, probably from a defective flue, and came near smothering and frightening the inmate, four in number, to death. The sheriff lives half a mile away, and no one else had a key. But little real damage was done, and had the prisoners been out our people would have been glad to have had the jail burned entirely.

### Insurance Business.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 18.—The *Coast Review*, a journal published in the interests of insurance companies, has issued tables showing the condition of business during the past year. Among other things, it says: "The result of the year's business, considered as a whole, was good or bad, according to the subject of comparison. The average loss ratio of 50.2 per cent. of the premium income was moderate admitting of a fair return to capital for the risk assumed."

### The Slave Trade.

BERLIN, Jan. 18.—The East Africa bill was submitted to the bundsrath to-day. It is entitled "A bill for the protection of German interests, and combating the slave trade in East Africa." It asks a grant of 2,000,000 marks. The task of executing the provisions of the bill is entrusted to a commission, who shall have a right to supervise the proceedings of the East African company.

### Tom Platt.

NEW YORK, Jan. 18.—The *Cincinnati Enquirer*, published Tuesday a dispatch from Washington, which stated on the alleged authority of Commodore Arthur Bateman, of this city, that three days before the recent election Thomas C. Platt demanded and received \$150,000, for the use of which no accounting was to be demanded.

### A Fire.

ST. PAUL, Jan. 18.—The general offices of the Chicago, St. Paul, Minneapolis & Omaha railroad were partially destroyed by fire to-day. Several clerks jumped from the second story and were quite severely injured. The loss is about \$40,000.
