Small Pox.

DENVER, Col., Jan, 18,-The report published in the East that people ore fleeing from this city because of a smallpox epidemic and that there are now from 700 to 800 cases, is false. From forty to fifty cases have been reported at the health office up to date, which is not greater than usual at this season year. The cases are very mtid, and there have been only three deaths so far.

Insurance Business.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 18 .- The Coast Re. view, a journal published in the interests of inzieru, a journal published in the interests of in-surance companies, has issued tables showing the condition of business during the past year. Among other things, it says: "The result of the year's business, considered as a whole, was good or bad, according to the subject of com-parison. The average loss ratio of 50.2 per cent, of the premium income was moderate admitting of a fair return to capital for the risk assumed.

BERLIN, Jan. 18.—The East Africa bill was BERLIN, Jan. 18.—The East Africa bill was submitted to the bundesrath to-day. It is entitled "A bill for the protection of German intesests, and combating the slave trade in East Africa." It asks a grant of 2,000,000 marks. The tark of executing the provisions of the bill is entrusted to a commission, who shall have a right to supervise the proceedings of the East African compony.
