TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Committed Suicide.

COTTAGE GROVE, Or., Jan. 21.—Mrs. Marion Martin, aged about 50, committed suicide Saturday by taking strychnine. Marion Martin, husband of the suicide, is a well-known pioneer of this section, and although 65 or 70 years of age, is very strong and powerful. Only when under the influence of liquor is he not a good citizen. She did the act because he took money belonging to her.

Good for England.

LONDON, Jan. 21.—It is stated on trust, worthy authority that the British government has decided to uphold the treaty, by the terms of which European powers are precluded from obtaining or attempting to obtain dominance in Samoa. The government has been fully informed of the action of the German agents in Samoa is opposed to the letter and the spirit of the treaty; that it violates diplomatic etiquette, and endangers the good relations so necessary for Europeans to preserve when dealing with semi-barbarous nations. Dispatches to this effect have been sent to Berlin.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21.—The secretary of war has transmitted to congress a letter from General Casey, chief of engineers, stating that it would cost \$200,000 to make a twenty foot channel in the Willamette river between Portland and Oswego Oregon.

Major Jones says that the only commercial interest seeking this improvement is the Oregon Iron and Steel Company, whose works are established at Oswego and who are now engaged in the manufacture of pig iron and cast iron pipe.

Fourteen Horses Burned.

HELENA, M. T., Jan. 21.—At 3 o'clock this morning John Seigler's livery stable here was destroyed by fire, and fourteen horses were burned to death. The struggles and screams of the perishing animals were extremely pitiful.

A Strike.

SEATTLE, W. T., Jan. 21.—In accordance with an order of the miners' executive committee of the district assembly of Knights of Labor, the miners at Gilman, Cedar Mountain, Black Diamond and Franklin this morning stopped work. The workmen at the two latter mines, however, held a consultation and concluded to resume work and were out only three hours. The Newcastle mine, which is operated entirely by members of the miners' union, was not immediately affected by the strike, and continues running during the day.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 21.—The following are the nativities of the voters of San Francisco, as shown by the great register: Australia, 260; Austria, 480; Canada, 1164; Denmark, 462; England, 2101; France, 766; Germany, 7456; Ireland, 10,368; Italy, 666; Norway, 308; Russia, 324; Scotland, 686; Spain, 32; Sweden, 602; Switzerland, 390; Wales, 140; other countries, 785; total foreigners, 26,960; total American born, 31,203; the natives of California number 10,463, or one-third of the whole number of native born.
