TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

On the Fight.

SIENANDOAN, Pa., Jan. 23.—The war between the Italian and Hungarian laborers employed at the mines reached a culmination near Barry's station, two miles from here, last night and a bloody fight followed in which several of the combatants were badly used up, and one Hungarian burned to death in a shanty, which was fired by the Italians during the progress of the fight.

BERLIN, Jan. 23.—The National Zeitung, discussing the government's colonial policy, declares that the independence of neither Zanzibar nor Samoa is menaced by Germany. All that is intended for is the preservation of the rights acquired by Germany in those regions.
