WASHINGTON, D. C. Jan. 27 .- Representative Hermann has secured the passage in the house of the hill pensioning Colonel James Waters, of Doaghs county, Or., the amount of pension being \$40 per month. Colonel Waters is over 92 years of age and one of the few survi-vors of the war in Oregon of 1812. During the Indian wars in Oregon he rendered valuable service to the then territory as colonel of a volunteer regiment.

Com-plete returns show the following result: Boulan-ger 244,070, Jacques 162,510, Boule 16,760, other candidates 10,039; Boulenger's plurality, 81,530; Boulanger's majority, 54,752.
