TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Pensioned.
WASHINGTON, D. C. Jan. 27.—Representative Hermann has secured the passage in the house of the bill pensioning Colonel James Waters, of Douglas county, Or., the amount of pension being \$40 per month. Colonel Waters is over 92 years of age and one of the few survivors of the war in Oregon of 1812. During the Indian wars in Oregon he rendered valuable service to the then territory as colonel of a volunteer regiment.

Boulanger Elected.
PARIS, Jan. 27.—The polls closed at 6 P. M. The attendance of voters was unprecedentedly large. Perfect quiet prevailed. Few police are seen on the streets, nearly all being held in reserve. The cabinet is expected to meet at the ministry of the interior to-morrow. Complete returns show the following result: Boulanger 244,070, Jacques 162,510, Boule 16,760, other candidates 10,039; Boulanger's plurality, 81,550; Boulanger's majority, 54,752.

Some Defeats.
ZANZIBAR, Jan. 27.—An engagement took place at Darel-Salim on Friday, resulting in the defeat of the Arabs, many of whom were killed. During the fight the first lieutenant of the German warship Sophie was killed by sunstroke. The defeat of the Arabs renders the position of the captured missionaries still more dangerous.

SUAKIM, Jan. 27.—A prominent merchant from Chartoum has confirmed the report that the Mahdi was defeated by Senussi. He also declares that the white prisoner was not a European, and certainly not Emin.

The Capital Removed.
PRESCOTT, A. T., Jan. 27.—The residents of this place are anything but pleased over the removal of the capital of this territory from here to Phoenix. Excitement over the indecent haste of the legislature to take from Northern Arizona the only public institution she possesses, has been at fever heat for several days, and an altercation occurred last night between Samuel Purdy, of Yuma county, and Governor Zulick, over a discussion of the question.

Rev. Moody.
SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 27.—To-day was the beginning of the last week of the season for which D. L. Moody was engaged to conduct revival services in this city, and it was also probably the last Sunday he will appear here. Next Sunday he will probably begin religious revival in Oakland.

A Footrace.
WICHITA, Kan., Jan. 27.—The 100 yard foot race between M. K. Kittleman, of this state, and Harry Bethune, a Canadian, for \$2000 a side, was won yesterday by Kittleman. Kittleman got the lead at the start and held it to the finish, winning by three feet, in 9 1/2 seconds. Another race is being arranged between them for \$1000 a side, to take place in Detroit.
