TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Over Work.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 20.—For the past day or two it has been privately known that President Cleveland had been compelled to stop work on account of sickness. He had denied himself to all comers this week, and intended to devote himself to disposing of the long amount of work that was on his desk, and accumulating every day. He complained especially of not feeling very well last evening and upon the advice of Mrs. Cleveland, the family physician was called in. He found the president suffering from nervous prostration by overwork, and recommended that he put aside his duties and take a rest. The report at the White House as to his condition is that he is now much better.

Whisky Did It.

ASHLAND, Wis, Feb. 20.—A most atrocious murder and suicide occurred at Upson this morning. A laborer named Joseph Brogan killed his wife and two children, aged respectively 5 and 7 years, and then committed with a dull razor. Brogan drank heavily, and had a heated quarrel with his wife this morning. He finally attacked his wife with the razor, and nearly severed her head from her body.

A Hot Time.

INDIANAPOLIS, Feb. 20.—There was an exciting scene in the state senate this morning. The republicans claimed that they were subject to gag rule, and Senator Johnson protested. The sergeant-at-arms threatened to remove him. Other republican senators gathered around him and defied the sergeant-at-arms.

A Drummer.

SEATTLE, Feb. 20.—F. Steinberger, who says he is a drummer, was examined to-day on a charge of stealing \$200 from another drummer, named J. G. Brigham. The two "knights of the gripsack" on Monday night started out to have a little time. Brigham left his hotel with \$600 in his pocket, and he returned to it next morning with \$64 and with twenty-seven "Peter Funk" watches which in his moments of exuberance, he had bought.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 20.—The president to-day sent to congress the correspondence on the Lord Sackville matter, with a purely formal letter of transmission.
