The Alaska seals have paid Uncle Sam for Alaska, which cost him \$7,000,000. Since 1870 the Alaska Commercial company has paid the government \$5,597,100 for seals killed. The customs duties from Alaska sealskins dressed in Europe have yielded in round numbers about \$4,000,000. By the new contract with the company the United States is to receive \$50,-000 per annum for two years and \$3 50 per head for each seal taken, the annual catch to be limited to 100,000 seals.
