Johnson, of St. Louis, to run a 100 yard race for a purse of \$2500 and what is claimed to be the championship of the world. Bethune wants the race here.

Moore Not Squire.

SPOKANE FALLS, March 20.—Private telegrams received here from Washington state that the president has decided to appoint Miles C. Moore governor of Washington territory and General McMicken collector of internal revenue.

Not For Sale.

MADRID, March 20.—In the senate to-day Senor Moret, minister of the interior, in reply to a question, said that the government had no knowledge of a scheme to sell Cuba to the United States. He declared that there was not enough money in the whole world to purchase the smallest part of the Spanish territory, and that if the necessity should arise, the Spaniards would know how to defend their country's soil.
