



TACOMA, April 3 .- The chamber of commerce last decided to petition the Northern Pacific railroad for a better train service in and out of Tacoma, and to have Tacoma made the terminus of the road in reality. The chamber wants the trains between here and St. Paul made continuous ones, without the change now made at Pasco, and to have trains made up and started from here instead of £t Portland,

SALEM, April 3 .- The examination of Dr. J F Moser, ex postmaster at Silverton, on a charge of opening a letter, took place this after-moon before J J Walton, United States com-missioner, and resulted in the discharge of the accused, there being no testimony to hold him.

A Big Opium Seizure.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 2 .- The custom house officers this morning seized 2224 five-tael house others this morning seized 2224 five-tael boxes of opium, valued at \$:5,568, which had been smugled. The drug was found concleated under a pile of fat in the soap r nd candle factory conducted by Richard Ahlp in South San Fran-cisco. Ahlp and H Gaehdez, a saloon keeper at the mail dock, were arrested and held by Judge Sawyer in \$2000 bonds. It is thought that the opium was lowered from the China steamer into the water and taken to the candle factory. Other arrests are expected to follow.

King of Holland.

TTE HAGUE, April 2-In parliament to-day TTE HAGUE, April 2-In parliament to-day the prime minister read the report of the court physicians on the condition of the king, which stated that his *w*-ajesty was suffering from chronic diabetes and nephritis, and was un-able to fulfill the duties of sovereign. The prime minister after reading the report, an-nounced that the council of state, in view of the king's condition, asked parliament to assent to the establishment of a regency. The de-cision on the subject will be given to-morrow.
