PORT TOWNSEND, April 9.—The head of a Chinaman was cut off at Port Discovery yesterday. He fell over a gangsaw, and his head was completely severed from the body, which was horribly mangled.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 9.—The case of Miss Freddie Stockmeyer vs. W. F. Rochester, the comedian, was called in one of the courts here to-day. The plaintiff sought and recovered judgment for \$65, salary for services as actress in Rochester's traveling company during November 1888.

Will Be Completed.

COLEMAN, W. T., April 9.—Work will be resumed on the O. R. & N. extension from Rockford to Spokane Falls in a few days, as soon as the surveyors now at work locate the exact line. A prominent official of the road says that cars will be running into Spokane Falls before June.

A City's Trouble.

SEATTLE, W. T., April 9.—Trouble which has been brewing for some time between Mayor Moran and the city council on one side, and Chief of Police Mitchell on the other, was precipitated into an open controversy to-day by a public statement of Mayor Moran that Chief Mitchell had utterly and willfully failed to perform his duty as head of the police department and that he was in collusion with the gamblers of the city.

CHICAGO, April 9.—Roswell P. Flower and family and several other New Yorkers arrived in this city this evening on their way West. They go in a special train to Colorado Springs, and thence to Denver, Salt Lake City, San Francisco and Southern California. After a short stay they will visit Portland, Oregon, and will return by the Northern route.

Charged With Conspiracy.

PARIS, April 9.—The indictment against Boulanger, besides charging with conspiracy to destroy the republic, is especially directed against Count Dillon, M. Laguerre, member of the chamber of deputies, Rochefort and Dubarrai, and two journalists in Paris.
