## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

**N W Appointments.**  
WASHINGTON, April 14.—The appointment by the president of Max Pracht to be collector of customs for the district of Alaska, is highly gratifying to that individual. Max was endorsed by the Pacific coast, including all the republican senators from California, Oregon and Nevada.  
William J. Mariner has been appointed postmaster at Blackfoot, Gillman county, Or., vice W. H. Mariner resigned.  
Milton Redding has been appointed postmaster at Lafayette, Yamhill county, Or., vice G. E. Johnson, resigned.  
A. C. Palmer has been appointed postmaster at Prineville, Crook county, Or., in place of J. F. Moore, resigned.  
George Vasey, of Washington territory, has been appointed special agent of the department of agriculture.

**Off the Track.**  
DELTA, Cal., April 14.—The south bound Oregon express struck an open switch five miles below Redding. The mail, baggage and two sleepers left the track. They were pulled on after ten hours delay. Nobody was hurt.

## He Shot Him.

WALLA WALLA, W. T., April 14.—At 1 P. M. today Sheriff McFarland and Constable Moore, in pursuit of two men charged with burglary at Prescott, overtook them, about nine miles east of Wallula, and ordered them to throw up their hands. The men fired on the officers, and the officers, returned the fire, and killed one. The dead man is named Tom Williams. They arrested the other man—named Dave Murphy. The latter fired five shots at the officers. William's pistol was a self-cocker, and refused to revolve when he tried to shoot. The coroner's jury said the action of the officer was justifiable.

## Boulanger Speechifier.

PARIS, April 14.—At a banquet at Versailles day, Deputy Laguerre read General Boulanger's speech. He contrasted the doings of the present "sham republicans" with the doings of the republicans of 1789, and said that on the hundredth anniversary the reforms then instituted must be completed.

## Big Strike Threatened.

CHICAGO, April 14.—The Daily News tomorrow will say: Twenty thousand men threatened to quit the employ of the Baltimore and Ohio railroad and tie up trains. The News goes into the details of compulsory insurance, mentioned in these dispatches last week as being the cause of the trouble, and adds that every employe in the service has been given to understand that he must sign a contract or be discharged. Determined and serious opposition to the company's orders has been organized, according to the News.
