Oregon's Greatest and Gamest Racehorse, with a Record of 2:29 3-4 first season after four years retirement, a performance never before equalled by any horse on the North Pacific Coast.

Will be at Albany, Friday and Saturday, at the McKnight farm, May 1st; at Salem, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, going by way of Jefferson and Turner Station and allowed to serve a limited number of mares. Oneco was sired by Altamont, wagon road, 2:26 3/4 in 8th heat. Dam, Belle Price by Double 2:28 (2 years record 2:40 1/2, fastest in the world for 4 years) son of Belison 1 1/4 year old record 2:30 1/2, fastest in the world for 14 years).
