Oneco was sired by Altamont, wagon road, 2:30 1/2 in 8th heat, Dan, Belle Price by Double 2:28 (2 years record 2:10 1/2, fastest in the world for 4 years) son of Grison 1 1/4 year old record 2:30 1/2, fastest in the world for 14 years. 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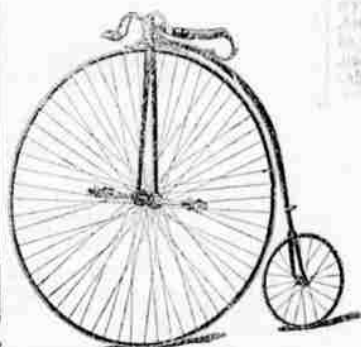
