BUSY MANHATTAN ISLAND.

It is doubtful if there is a busier spot in the world of the same size than Manhattan Island. With the year ending with September the elevated railroads of New York City carried more than 170,000,000 passengers. And that is a passenger traffic only four and a half million less than the whole traffic of the German empire for the same time, with its 18,000 miles of roads! In France, where there is more travel, the record is 205,273,340 passengers carried over her 29,144 miles of road, which is about 15 per cent more than went up and down in New York and wandered to and fro in it during the same time. In this country during the same time there were carried 428,255,513 passengers over the 149,912 miles of road; but in this were included the 170,000,000 of New York's intramural record. So it appears that this traffic was about 40 per cent of the traffic of the whole country, and it was carried on 32½ miles of track.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Tacoma Election

TACOMA, May 7.—The city election came off to-day, and the democrats have elected S. A. Wheelwright mayor by about 150 majority. The courts in the Second and Third wards are progressing very slowly, but so far indicate the election of Charles T. Uhlman, rep., for councilman over Louis E. Post, demo rat, by a good majority in the second ward. In the third ward J. M. Dugon, democrat, is elected over J. B. Cromwell, republicans, by a considerable majority. In the first ward there is a tie for councilman, between Conway, republican, and John N. Fuller, ex chief of police, democrat. John Horvath, democrat, is re-elected by a large majority for councilman over Baker, republican. So far the count indicates the election of the remainder of the republican ticket: W. H. Snell, city attorney; T. C. Armstrong, treasurer; C. O. Bean, surveyor, and J. P. Higgins, street commissioner.

Nominations.

WASHINGTON, May 7.—The president made the following appointments to-day.
A. I. Thomas, of Salt Lake City, governor of Utah.
Ellsworth Daggett, of Utah, surveyor general. Perry Johnson, of Idaho, register of the land office at Blackfoot, Idaho.
William H. Daniels, of Idaho, receiver of Joseph at Blackfoot, Idaho.
Joseph F. Bennett, of New Mexico, agent for the Indians of the Mescalero agency, New Mexico.
The president this evening appointed Frank W. Palmer, of Illinois, to be public printer, and Theodore Roosevelt, of New York, and Hugh S. Thompson, of South Carolina, to be civil service commissioners.

Bad Weather.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 7.—Terror from landslides is feared by the Southern Pacific Company along the Shasta division, where rain was falling heavily to day. Some small slides occurred, and the loosening of the ground has been so general in the cuts that much damage is threatened. Snow has fallen to a depth of two feet on the Siskiyou range. The Southern Pacific reported to day that four and a half feet of snow had fallen at the summit of the Central Pacific railroad, and that it was still snowing.

A Big Storm.

ST. PAUL, May 7.—It had been blowing hard all day yesterday and last night in the Northwest. The wind to-day increased to a gale and considerable damage was done. At Fargo, Dak., some buildings were blown down. Reports are coming in from the country of damage to building and crops. At Buffalo, in this county, the storm reached its greatest severity, wheat in many places being blown out of the ground by the wind. In other places it is buried so deep that it will never come up.

Take Possession.

NEW ORLEANS, May 7.—The *Times Democrat's* Lafayette special says: Four hundred armed men, under General Alexander DeClautte of St. Martin's parish, rode into Lafayette this morning, took possession of the town, and demanded the resignation of a negro justice of the peace and negro constables. The latter had disappeared, but the former complied with their demand.
