NEW YORK, May 16.—The one hundred and first annual session of the general assembly of Presbyterian churches was begun this morning. About 1500 delegates were present from all over the country.

At 4 p m Charles A. Dickey, of Philadelphia, William C. Roberts, of Chicago, and J. M. Warral, of New York, were nominated to the office of moderator. Dr. Roberts was elected by 53 plurality. He was induced into office, and a recess was had until evening.
