Harrison has been president of the United States two months. They have been very busy months, and the party heads have had their hands more than full making vacancies for the clamorous mob of insatiate Republican spoils hunters. The chiefs of government departments and divisions have concealed the actual number of Democrats removed, for they are ashamed to let the public know it. There never was a time when so many removals were made in the same space of time. If the truth could be got at, it is probable that under Harrison more officials have been turned out in sixty days than under Cleveland in four years. At any rate, the service has been so thoroughly cleared of Democrats in that brief period that the president has felt that he could reconstruct the civil service commission, which has been all this time a completely dismantled affair.

A Big Race.

FRESNO, Cal., May 20.—The Fresno Fair
Ground Association is displaying great energy
in preparing for the two miles and repeat race
for \$20,000, to be run September 20.

The conditions of the race provide that the
entrance fee shall be 10 per cent of the purse.
The purse will be divided into four parts \$10,
000 to go to the winner, \$5000 to the second
horse, \$3000 to the third, and \$2000 to the
fourth. Three horses enter, two to start.
