It would be difficult to conceive of a sentence or paragraph published in a newspaper at which some one would not rise up and complain. TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

The Pendleton P.O. PENLETON, Or., May 28.—Postal Inspector Culver is in the city, inquiring in to the charge against Postmaster Clopton. He is charged with assaulting T. McBrean through the delivery window, with betting on the November election, with collecting rent for the postoffice, from business houses of Main street, also from the government, and trusting the business of the office to incompetent subordinates.

A Cyclone. KANSAS CITY, May 28.—A *Times* special from Emporia, Kan., says: A disastrous cyclone passed over Clemons, Chase county, this afternoon. Captain Brown and his daughter were killed, and his wife had her leg almost torn off and a son had a leg and an arm broken. It is reported that six or seven other persons were killed, but the wires are all down, and no reliable information can be obtained.

The Murderers. CHICAGO, May 28.—Detective Daniel Coughlin, Patrick Sullivan, the ice man, and Frank J. Black, alias Woodruff, were indicted by the grand jury this evening for the murder of Dr. Cronin. This result was reached after an investigation which began at noon and lasted for seven hours, during which two dozen witnesses were examined and a mass of evidence was considered.

A Baker County Murder. BAKER CITY, Or., May 28.—A man named Pennington shot and killed another man named Balcom, near Rye valley in this county, today. Particulars have not been ascertained. The coroner has gone to the scene of the homicide to investigate.

Doctors Arrested. HELENA, M. T., May 28.—Doctors Weyerhorst, Harding and Schultz, of Butte, were indicted yesterday for practicing medicine without a certificate from the medical board, as provided by the act of the last legislature.

A Thief Captured. INDEPENDENCE, Or., May 28.—Thomas Hogan, who lately came here from San Francisco, last night, broke into Alex Davis's room at the City hotel and stole therefrom one suit of clothes and a revolver, all valued at \$25. He immediately skipped but was caught at Eola to-day by Marshal Wayne Williams and was brought back and lodged in jail here. He was given an examination this afternoon before Justice Butler and was bound over to appear before the grand jury in the sum of \$500.
