Word comes by way of Canada that there are prospects of negotiations being opened at an early date for the settlement of the fisheries question. According to report unofficial assurances have been received by the Canadian government that the present administration in the United States, like the last one, is disposed to favor the adjustment of the various disputes, commercial and otherwise, at present existing between the two countries. The understanding in Canada appears to be that the initiative in resuming negotiations will be taken by the United States. However this may be it is certain that the prospects for the conclusion of negotiations are at present much better than they were when the last attempt at a settlement was made. The political friction which was a main element in bringing about the rejection of the last treaty has been removed, the President and Senate, the necessary factors in treaty making, being now of the same political complexion.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Johnstown.

JOHNSTOWN, June 4.—The water receded in the night almost as rapidly as it came, and behind it remains a sight scarcely imaginable. The dove that comes has not the green leaf of promise, for its wings are draped with a hue of mourning and desolation.

Before the windows of the Associated Press headquarters lies the great skeleton of dead Johnstown. Great ribs of rocky sand stretch across the chest, scarred and covered with abrasions. Acres of land, acres of wreckage, acres of unsightly, tottering buildings, acres of unknown dead, acres of ghastly objects which have been eagerly sought for since Friday, acres of smoking, steaming ruins lie out here in the sunshine. It is awful to think of the hundreds of bodies lying along the river banks and under the piles of log timbers, and trouble will come from them, because they are hard to find and harder to dig out.

CHICAGO, June 4.—Frank B. Felt and Sydney McCloud, both of this city, were in Johnstown on the fatal Friday when it was buried beneath the waters of the deadly reservoir.

They returned to this city this evening, and Felt was seen to night and modestly told of the heroic part which himself and friend took on that day. Mr. Felt said that, judging from the number of people whom he saw around Johnstown immediately before the flood, he would not be at all surprised if the list of the drowned would, when completed, number 20,000.

What One City Did.

PITTSBURG, June 4.—Two hundred thousand dollars in money and \$50,000 in provisions and clothing has been donated by this city in aid of the Johnstown flood sufferers.

More Than Half a Million.

WASHINGTON, June 4.—The aggregate of flood subscriptions reported in Associated Press dispatches received from various sections to night is \$551,000. The aggregate reported Monday night was \$406,000.

A R R Compromise.

NEW YORK, June 4.—President Adams and Oakes, of the Union and Northern Pacific railroads, are said to have reached a full understanding concerning the approaching election of the Oregon Railway & Navigation Company and will secure a unanimous vote for the board of directors for that company, to be jointly agreed upon between Henry Villard and General G. M. Dodge, in Portland, Or., on the 17th inst. All litigation in the New York courts affecting the Navigation company's interests will be dismissed.

A Mine on Fire.

GRASS VALLEY, Cal., June 4.—The Idaho mine has been closed to smother the fire which has been raging there since yesterday. Thomas Dugan and John Ralph could not be rescued; they are surely dead by this time. All of the others are safe, excepting Frank Carter, whose head was taken off between the ascending and descending cages as they passed.
