TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

At Seattle.

SEATTLE, June 9.—Everybody will be put to work in the morning, clearing up the burnt district, and those who are idle and will not work will be required to leave the city. There will be no free lunch for the bums after to-morrow.

The clerks of Seattle, which formed one in considerable part of the population, are in despair. Many of them lost all they had but the clothes on their back, and are out of employment. Some of them have, through false pride gone hungry rather than eat at the free meal tents.

The insurance adjusters are rapidly accomplishing the adjustment of losses and are paying insurance. The remarkable confidence of the heaviest losers for the future has been contagious, and there is very little discouragement expressed in the city.

The estimated loss remains the same as reported, \$15,000,000.

Johnstown.

JOHNSTOWN, June 9.—To-day is the tenth since the disaster in the Conemaugh valley occurred, and the extent of the fatality can be appreciated when it is known that bodies are still being found wherever men are at work.

The work of registration of the survivors of the flood is going steadily on. Up to this evening there were about 21,000 registered, and the list is still increasing.

The number lost is placed now at 5000 by those who held it would reach 10,000 a week ago. A conservative estimate is between 3500 and 4000. Up to date there have been 1500 bodies recovered.

Paris Excited.

PARIS, June 9.—A Boulangist meeting announced for to-day was prohibited by the authorities. Dervilede, Laquerore, and a score of citizens were arrested for protesting against the action of the authorities. The populace is in a ferment to their barracks.

Villards Party.

TACOMA, June 9.—Henry Villard and the two New York attorneys, Beaman and Solomon, were driven around the city this morning by Isaac W Anderson, manager of the Tacoma Land Agent Paul Schulte, went to Seattle this afternoon, where they will remain and await the arrival of President T F Oakes on Tuesday, and go to Portland on the following day.
