PARTISAN BIGOTRY.

The state of the weather warns the philosophic mind against taking a heated view of certain exhibitions of partisan bigotry which under other conditions might warrant a high temperature indignation.

But perhaps it is just as well as it is certainly more comfortable, to laugh at such ebullitions of party spirit as that which led to an "indignation meeting" at Strong City, Kansas—ominous name!—over the recommendation by Senator Plumb of Dr. Zane, a democrat, for member of the Board of Pension Examiners. "Violently denunciatory speeches were made by half a dozen prominent republican politicians," says the despatch, "and there will be adopted resolutions of censure which will be sent to President Harrison and Senator Plumb."

Did these Kansas zealots hold any indignation meeting when democrats enlisted for the war? Did they cry out "No democrats need apply" when there were quotas of soldiers to be filled? Do they scorn to receive collections from democratic taxpayers when the big pension bills are to be paid?

The fact that Senator Plumb recommended a democratic doctor for Pension Examiner is presumptive proof that the man was an army surgeon. Is there anything more comical, if you choose to look at it from the funny side, than the violent assumption of the provincial republican partisan that no man is entitled to hold any office under the Government who didn't vote for Benjamin Harrison?

To-morrow the people of Rhode Island vote on the question whether they will repeal their prohibitory amendment. There are indications that the repeal will carry.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Appointments.

WASHINGTON, June 18.—The president made the following appointments to-day: William R Bishop, agent at the Klamath agency, Oregon.

Lucius Fairchild, ex-commander in chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, has been appointed a member of the Sioux commission.

Postmasters: John Corcoran, Denver, Colorado; John F Rice, Oursay, Colorado; Emerio R Leonard, Boise City, Idaho; Benjamin S, Harroughs, Pendleton, Oregon.

Will be Surveyed.

EUGENE, Or., June 18.—The directors of the Sinclair & Eastern Railway & Navigation Company held a meeting at the office of the secretary of the company in this city to-day. Mr O Boomhower was elected general agent of the company, and it was resolved to make a preliminary survey of the line between Florence and this city immediately, and the president and secretary were authorized to employ competent engineers to survey the line and complete the estimates for the same.

An Indiana Storm.

INDIANAPOLIS, June 18.—A destructive wind storm swept over Peru, Ind., this afternoon, doing great damage. Trees, fences and telegraph and telephone poles were leveled, and many dwellings injured.

Several freight cars standing on the Lake Erie & Western tracks were caught by the wind and pushed with great velocity through the walls of shop buildings. The total loss will be many thousands of dollars.

Election in Pennsylvania.

PHILADELPHIA, June 18.—The voting on the prohibition amendment proceeded quietly. The day was clear, and there was a light vote. There was a notable absence of women from the polls, and the distribution of ice water and sandwiches was not so profuse as was anticipated.

Returns from forty four out of sixty seven counties show a majority against the prohibition amendment of 169,454. Full returns from the whole state will probably raise the figures to nearly 200,000.

At Seattle.

SEATTLE, June 18.—Mayor Moran and Colonel J C Haines, commanding the first regiment, held a consultation to-day, and it was determined that it would be safe to withdraw the militia to-morrow. A part of the force will be taken off in the morning, and if no disturbance occurs, more at noon, and then, if all appears serene, the remainder will be withdrawn at night.
