TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

A Hong Kong Storm.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 30.—The steamer
Rio de Janeiro arrived late to-night from Hong-
kong and Yokohama.

One of the most destructive rain storms in
the history of Hongkong occurred May 29 and
30. The total rainfall for thirty three hours
was twenty nine and a half inches, at times the
fall measuring nearly three inches per hour.
Hongkong papers do not venture to estimate
the loss to private property, such as residences,
stores, etc., but place the estimated loss to
public property at about \$200,000. Fifteen
lives in all were known to have been lost when
the steamer sailed for America.

A Sand Storm.

ARLINGTON, Or., June 30.—Another sand-
storm has delayed three trains near Grant's to-
day, and the engine of one train has been off
the track. The ball game was not played here
on this account, as The Dalles nine are on
the passenger train which should have been
here at 2:30 p. m. An effort will be made to
persuade The Dalles club to play the game to-
morrow, but it is doubtful if they will.

NORTHFIELD, Mass., June 30.—Three hun-
dred students to-day attended the Moody con-
ference of college students, which will last until
July 10. Sessions will be held morning and
evening, the afternoon being devoted to athlet-
ics, under direction of A A Stagg, Yale's pitch-
er. Rev I D Driver, D D., of Portland, Or.,
is a leading speaker. Moody preached this
afternoon.
