THE SOURCE OF THE SURPLUS.

All the money collected by General Government goes into one Treasury, or public account. There is no separation of the revenues. When there is a surplus it results from excessive taxation in the aggregate. And when the revenue is to be reduced the only questions are, What taxes can best be spared? What reduction will give the most relief to the greatest number of people?

A monopoly organ persistently urges that legislation to reduce the surplus should begin with the internal taxes. They are denounced as "war taxes." But 15 points, or more than 30 per cent., of the present tariff are war taxes also. And three fourths of these are levied upon the necessities of the people, while all of the remaining internal taxes are levied upon vices or indulgences—namely, upon spirits and tobacco.

The trouble with past legislation to reduce the surplus is that it has begun with the internal taxes and for many years has stopped there. Of all the intricate system built up during the war only the taxes on whisky and tobacco remain, and the proceeds of these, oppressing nobody, just about pay the war legacy of interest and pensions. If the surplus has a particular source it is in the tariff, which now averages 47 per cent. against 32 per cent. at the beginning of the war, and produces \$225,000,000, against \$179,000,000 at the close of the war.

The Democratic policy of tariff reform looks to relief of the Treasury and a relief of the people at the same time. To cut off the revenue from the internal taxes would be simply to throw away revenue for the purpose of perpetuating the Trust fostering and burdensome high tariff.

No other man has so direct an influence, once a week on the minds and hearts of so many people, as the newspaper editor. A Gamy Dervish.

LONDON, July 18.—In the commons this afternoon Stanhope, secretary of state for war, read the reply of Nad el Junu, the dervish leader in Egypt, in response to the demand of General Grenfell for his surrender. Nad el Junu says:

"Your force is nothing to me. I have been sent to conquer the world, and I cannot stop now. I call upon you to surrender. I will protect you. Remember Hicks and Gordon."

General Grenfell states that the dervishes are well fed and in good condition.

A Farmer Killed.

OREGON CITY, July 18.—Elias Edwards, a farmer living five miles south of town, was killed last night by the kick of a horse. He had been working in the harvest field during the afternoon, and was watering his horses when one—a three year old colt—is supposed to have kicked him. He walked about twelve rods up the hill to a small gate, and called to his brother in law that he was hurt. He was helped to the house and in fifteen minutes he was dead. Several ribs were found to be broken on the right side, but death is supposed to have been caused by internal injuries. He was an exemplary neighbor and citizen.

A Green Banker.

LANSING, Mich., July 18.—A sharper named Streeter, worked the gold brick dodge to a successful issue here last night, upon William McKellops, a wealthy gentleman, of Perry, Shawassee county, and president of the First National bank of Corvallis.

An appointment was made last night, and as a result McKellops was made the owner of two supposed gold bricks, valued at \$20,000 and the sharper was richer by \$4000. When McKellops's grandson was shown the bricks, the fraud was discovered.

After Them.

NEW YORK, July 18.—A detective from Mississippi arrived to-day with a requisition from Governor Lowry, of Mississippi, calling for the arrest of Charlie Mitchell and Mike Donovan. He has no requisition for Sullivan, Kilrain or McEllohan. Search is being made for them.

Half a Million.

JOHNSTOWN, Pa., July 18.—The distribution of the \$500,000, which the state commission said should be made to the flood sufferers, began to day. Judge Cumming fled with the Sixth ward, and expects to be able to pay out to the claimants each day until he gets through. He will take the district by wards to enable him to handle the matter systematically.
