GOOD WORK.

Editors Democrat:

There is proof that honesty still prevails in managing public institutions. Let all doubters examine the management of our state penitentiary and they will find that under its present management the running expenses are several thousands less than under the republican superintendent, George Collins. How is it that a democrat can run the penitentiary for several thousands dollars less per year than a republican although the institution has about 80 more convicts? Let republican tax payers open their eyes to this important fact. To republican voters and tax payers I would say, is it not strange that most republican leaders after having held office a while become bankers, merchants, railroad magnates and even millionaires? Look at the management of the penitentiary under George S. Downing. He will show you what honest management means. A writer in the East Oregonian gives his views of the management of the penitentiary after having carefully investigated its workings. He is a detective and is competent to judge. Here is what he says: "I think the Oregon penitentiary is one of the best managed institutions in the United States. Irons are never used here on the shoulders or legs of prisoners, nor is solitary confinement resorted to except in extreme cases. To my surprise, the prisoners all work faithfully under the superintendence of Warden McKinnon. The successful way he controls so many criminals is worthy of public notice and commendation. The condition of the Oregon penitentiary has surprised the traveling detectives who make a business of secretly investigating the prison affairs of different States. I have had over twenty years experience in dealing with criminals, more or less; yet the way McKinnon handles most of these men, without iron or brutal treatment, is sometimes a mystery even to me. Superintendent Downing is an unassuming man, but a perfect man for the work he has to do. His rules and system of government have been considered as models by detectives and visitors from other and older States, and the people of Oregon have reason to be proud of the conduct of this institution. Under Mr. Downing's superintendency it is no doubt unexcelled in the United States. All the officers of the prison are deserving of praise in their several stations. They are: George S. Downing, superintendent; M J McKinnon, warden; George Barr, clerk. The rules of the institution are strictly enforced. No guard is allowed to use profane language to any prisoner, nor to abuse them in any way. Nor are they allowed to engage in drinking and gambling when on or off duty. Honesty, sobriety and strict attention to duty are the qualifications of guards in this prison. The management is a credit to the state. SCIO.
