The claim is just. Under President Harrison's administration there has been a larger percentage of removals from office than in the first four months of any president since Lincoln.

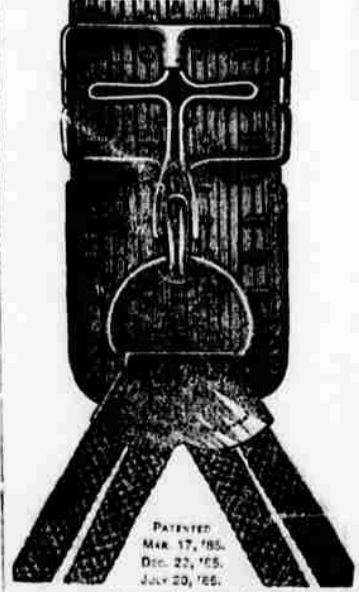
