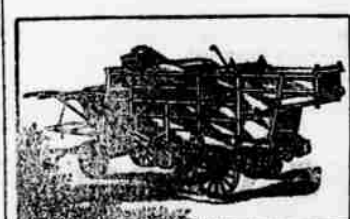

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Boulanger Defeated.

PARIS, July 29.—Returns from the elections have been received from 813 cantons. In these 468 republicans, 245 conservatives and 11 Boulangerists were elected. In nineteen a second ballot will be necessary. The government is jubilant. The result is not known in 1200 cantons. Boulanger has been elected in only twelve. The conservatives gained twenty seats. Wilson, son in law of ex President Grevy, was defeated. The Boulangerists are depressed by the result of the elections.

Wheat Matters.

POMONA, Cal., July 29.—Private letters received here to-day from M G Arnold, now in London, and who has great grain interests in the San Joaquin valley and Oregon, state that he has never known in the past thirty years so great interest in American and particularly in the Pacific coast wheat crop as prevails abroad this season. London grain buyers, he writes, openly say the shortage of wheat in Russia and India will be greater than at any time within ten years, and that the American product will come into large demand.

Will Insist Hirsch.

SEATTLE, July 29.—Sunset Cox arrived at Seattle this morning from Tacoma and was received by a delegation of citizens and driven around the town. This evening he addressed a large meeting at the armory. He leaves for Portland to-morrow, where he will be the guest of Senator John H Mitchell. While there he will meet Mr Solomon Hirsch, the new minister to Turkey, and give him advice as to the duties of his new office.

To the K T Conclave.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 29.—Local passenger agents were notified to-day that the Transcontinental Association had made a round trip rate of \$107.75 between the Pacific coast and Washington, D C., for the benefit of those desiring to attend the Knights Templar triennial convocation next October. Tickets will be good for sixty days.

Forest Fires.

CHICO, Cal., July 29.—Large forest fires are raging on the Humboldt road, eighteen miles from Chico. The fire has burnt over a district of four miles in length and is sweeping everything before it. Much valuable timber has been destroyed. People are fighting the fire, and expect to get it under control to-day.

Should Win.

OMAHA, July 29.—Suit was brought to-day by the widow of J A Little, of Sewickley, a commercial traveler, to recover \$50,000 from the South Fork Fishing Club, the millionaire owners of the South Fork dam above Johnston, Pa., her husband having lost his life at that place during the flood caused by the breaking of the dam May 31.
