the Confederate Army, was made Chief of the
Railroad Division in the General Land Office

master at Augusta by the reinstated Joe Man-
ley. The Harrison Administration, taking its
cue from its chief, evidently regards public
offices in the same light that Mr Blaine did
trusts—as "largely private affairs."

An Easy Thing.
SEATTLE, W. T., Aug. 12.—Fifteen prisoners
escaped from the city jail last night. All but
three, who were charged with robbery, were
drunks or vagrants. Prisoners, as a rule,
don't stay in the jail longer than they choose.

A Big California Fire.
TRUCKEE, Cal., Aug. 12.—A disastrous fire
occurred at 4:30 this afternoon, burning all
east of Bridge street and north of the railroad,
to the round house. The American hotel,
Irwin's livery stable, the Methodist and Catholic
churches, two school houses, Elen's lumber
yard, Good Temples hall, and thirty dwellings
were burned, rendering many families home-
less. Loss about \$75,000.

"You Bet" You.
NEVADA, Cal., Aug. 12.—Last night at
Rudolph Spiller's saloon, a mile from "You
Bet" railroad station, a free fight occurred, in
which a foreigner shot Samuel Hodge in the
neck, William Shea in the groin and also
killed another Italian, Spiller escaped by
hiding behind a beer keg. The crowd finally
got the Italian from under the table, where he
was white shooting, and kicked him so it
is believed he will die. Sheriff Dunster has
gone to the scene of the trouble.

Bound to Hang.
LIVERPOOL, Aug. 12.—Monday, August 26,
has been fixed upon as the day for the execution
of Mrs Maybrick.

Mr Lincoln, United States minister, and
the members of the American colony at London
have signed a petition for the reprieve of Mrs
Maybrick.
The petition circulated in Liverpool in behalf
of the prisoner has received 100,000 signatur-
es.

Speedy Justice.
CATLETTSBURG, Ky., Aug. 12.—A widow
named Gillis and her two daughters, nearly
grown, living in McDowell county, West
Virginia, were found dead by the neighbors last
Friday. They had been criminally assaulted
and murdered. The Hollis brothers were
suspected, and a vigilance committee was
organized to punish them. The captain of a
boat that arrived down the Big Sandy from
Pikeville this morning reports that the Hollis
brothers were captured by the committee, hung
up by the heels to the limb of a tree and then
shot to death.
