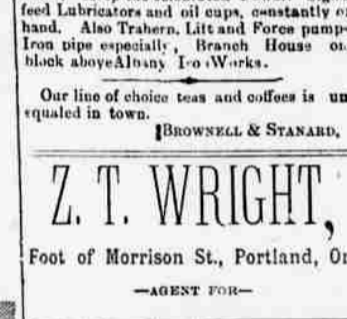

## A TRIP TO EASTERN OREGON.

I have been requested by parties living in Eastern Oregon to write up the country as I saw it during my travels through that part of the state that lies between the Dalles on the north and Warm Springs Reservation on the south, and the Deschute River on the east and Cascade Mt's on the west. The first place of any note that the writer passed through after leaving the Mountains was Juniper Flat, which is about 25 miles long by 8 or 10 miles wide. This part of the country is the most dry and desolate that the writer ever traveled over, not a spear of green grass could be seen along the road as far as the eye could reach, no grain, no garden, and no water, you cannot get a drink for your self or beast after you leave Bear creek until you reach the Deschute River, a distance of 28 miles, unless you get it out of a barrel where the thermometer registers from 110 to 125 and it takes considerable gall to ask a man to let you water your horse at his barrel that he has hauled perhaps 6 or 8 miles. I left Bear creek at 5 a m and reached C. L. Morris is at the upper end of Juniper Flat at 2:30 p.m. After partaking of some refreshments I started and traveled 6 miles to get a drink for my self and horse. In this whole country known as Juniper Flat there is not to exceed 3 families, but who have to haul water from 3 to 12 miles, the people who inhabit this wild waste are sociable, kind and obliging but have a far away look like the man that is watching for his ship to come in. They seem to have a longing expression on their countenances, which plainly show to the writer that they are not contented, but longing for the good old Willamette Valley. There is no grain to be had in it, all being burnt out from the scorching rays of a clear sun, Mr Green Morris cut from 85 acres of Spring wheat the enormous amount of 6 tons of hay. Mr C. L. Morris cut from 45 acres of fall wheat 40 tons of hay and he is the only man on the Flat who had any hay to speak of. Wheat would run from 6 to 10 inches in height. The writer passed many a field of wheat that would not measure 8 inches in height. Not being altogether stuck on the Juniper Flat I wended my way northward, crossing the white river at Tygh Valley, after crossing Tygh ridge I reached the rolling country south of the Dalles, which is a very dry and desolate country. At the town of Athens seeing a large windmill pump stopped to water my horse and self but when I called for a glass of water was informed that it was hauled 8 miles and had been standing in a barrel over night. I was also informed that they made daily trips with a four horse team to supply the store and for family use. After leaving Athens I traveled ten miles and reached Dufur on 15 mile creek, which has always furnished a large quantity of water but at the present time is just barely running. At Dufur I paid \$1.00 per bushel for oats and had to plead starvation for my horse before I could get them at that price, at Tygh Valley 25¢ per lb was charged for oats, also at the Summit house, and hay sold from \$20 to \$30 per ton by the feed. Now in conclusion let me say to those who contemplate leaving the Willamette Valley to make their stake in the country that I have just given a brief account of, that they had better leave well enough alone, for there are more leaving the Eastern Oregon country than you can imagine and but few going there.
