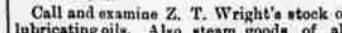

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

A Salem Fire.

SALEM, Or., Aug. 15.—A fire started to-night at 8:40 in Dr. Shelton's barn on Division street, between Commercial and Front, and was quickly communicated to two other barns across the alley. Each contained hay and grain, and being a long distance from the fire alarm the fire got a good headway before the fire companies arrived. The cause of the fire is unknown. One of the stables contained two imported stallions belonging to C. M. Beck worth several thousand dollars, but these were saved.

Fall of Burglars.

SEATTLE, W. T., Aug. 15.—Seattle is overrun with criminals. Half a dozen burglaries were committed last night, and foot pads held up a citizen on a Jackson street. This afternoon the police raided three gambling houses and one Chinese lottery game, and the inmates were fined.

To-night the police raided a number of houses in Whitechapel, and nine women were arrested and fined.

Field to be Arrested.

STOCKTON, Aug. 15.—A warrant has been issued and placed in the hands of Sheriff Cunningham for the arrest of Justice Field. It was issued by the district attorney on complaint of Mrs. Terry, who charges Justice Field with complicity in the killing of her husband.

A Murderer Lynched.

ROSLYN, W. T., Aug. 14.—Fred Trotman, a saloonkeeper, last night shot and dangerously wounded a coal miner named Thomas T. Thomas and this morning lynched by the miners. Thomas owed Trotman a small bill of \$2, which Trotman asked him in an insulting way to pay. Thomas answered by saying he had not the money now, but would pay him as soon as possible. Without further provocation Trotman drew a revolver and shot him, the bullet striking one and a half inches above the heart. Thomas was game, and after he fell shot at Trotman twice, but did not strike him.
