COMBINATION CONFERENCE.
At a meeting of representatives of the Grange,
Prohibitionists, Union Labor men, and Knights
of Labor, held in Salem August the 10th, Dr
J. F. Hendrix, of Harrisburg District, Master
Workman of the K. of L., was made chairman
and G. M. Miller, of the Pacific Express, was
made Secretary. After consultation the follow-
ing call for a state conference was issued:

Whereas, notwithstanding all the work
heretofore done in the way of agitation for re-
form, the power of the saloon in politics is con-
tinually increasing and has become a menace
to the nation's existence, the power of trusts
and corporations has become an intolerable
tyranny, the encroachments of land grabbers
have almost exhausted the public domain and
the corruption of the ballot has rendered our
elections little less than a disgraceful farce, and,
Whereas, the dominant political parties have
demonstrated their indisposition and their
inability to effectively oppose these evils which
destroy and imperil the life, liberty and property
rights of the people, and none of the minor
political organizations have been able to com-
mand a sufficient vote to gain the confidence of
the people who earnestly desire a better state
of things, in their final success, we believe the
time has come for a consolidation of all reform
forces in a combined movement for the over-
throw of these evils.

Therefore, we, as members of these reform
organizations and of the preliminary conference
convened in Salem, Or., this 10th day of
August, 1889, earnestly invite all who are in
sympathy with the said union reform movement
throughout the State of Oregon to unite in send-
ing delegates to a union reform conference to
convene at Salem, September 14th, 1889, at
11 o'clock a. m.

The said conference shall be composed of one
delegate from each voting precinct in the State,
to be chosen by a union primary and one dele-
gate from each labor organization, Prohibition
party, and Union club, and one additional dele-
gate for each 100 members of such organization
or club.

The object of this conference shall be to
consider the practicability of a union of all the
above named reform forces and of all citizens
not identified with these organizations, but
who are in favor of better government, in a
political party that pledges itself for the settle-
ment of the great questions now pressing for
settlement by legislation, and of all kindred
questions that may arise; and if such consoli-
dation is agreed upon, to adopt a platform and
to provide for thorough county and precinct orga-
nization of the state, preparatory to the nomi-
nation of state and county union tickets.

One View.

maries to-night resulted in a complete victory
for the Hoyt Kinnear wing of the party sup-

Gov.

evening give twenty eight delegates to the
county convention in favor of John P. Hoyt for
United States senator, and John R. Kinnear
for governor, and twenty delegates in favor of
ex Governor Watson C. Squire for senator and
ex Governor E. P. Ferry for governor. Squire
and Ferry think they have a good show for the
balance of the county.

Fresno Bar Association to-day, Judge Harris
appointed a committee to draft resolutions of
respect to the memory of David S. Terry, some
of the members spoke against the propriety of
such a course, but the committee prepared the
resolutions, and were ready to report when W.
D. Grady moved that action be postponed until
the arrival of Reel B. Terry, nephew of the
deceased, who had telegraphed that he would
arrive on Friday or Saturday, carried.

A Long Fast.
INDIANAPOLIS, Aug. 20.—Robert Marvel,
after fasting for sixty seven days, died this
morning. His case is so extraordinary that
it has attracted the attention, not only of a
curious public, but of the medical fraternity far
and near. He was 85 years old.

Rained Pitchforks.
ST. PAUL, Aug. 20.—The storm which pre-
vailed last night and this morning was one of
the most severe ever experienced here. Two
inches of water fell between 2 and 5 o'clock,
and the lightning was constant and vivid. The
storm was general throughout the section, in
some places doing considerable damage.

CHICAGO, Aug. 20.—Sidney Dillon, the
railway magnate, and John Sloane, a wealthy
New York carpet manufacturer, left the city
this afternoon for a long western trip. The
members of their families and a few friends

the Northern Pacific.
