SALT FOR MOTHS.

For moths salt is the best exterminator. The nuns in one of the hospital convents have tried everything else without success, and their experience is valuable, as they have so much clothing of the sick who go there, and strangers, when dying there, often leave quantities of clothing, etc. They had a room full of feathers, which were sent there for pillow making, and they were in despair, as they could not exterminate the moths, until they were advised to try common salt. They sprinkled it around, and in a week or ten days were altogether rid of the moths. They are never troubled now. In heavy velvet carpets sweeping them with salt cleans and keeps them from moths, as particles of the salt remains in the carpets and corners. Salt is not hurtful to any one, and has no bad smell. Here is a little hint I add, which, perhaps, every one does not know: For cleaning wash basins, baths, etc., use the same thing, common dry salt. Rub a little of the salt with your fingers on the basin. Often a sort of scum is noticed in the basins in a marble washstand in the bathroom; the salt takes it off easily, and leaves the basin shining and clean.

There is one thing that people have got to learn, and the sooner they begin the better, and that is not to handle electric wires. Like the statute laws, ignorance excuses no one. The latest victim is a servant girl at Cleveland, Ohio, who "innocently" picked up a wire which happened to be heavily charged, and the shock received may prove fatal. And still there is a question whether electricity will kill a man or not. Accidents of this kind ought to prove something.

Not least among the merits of Professor W. T. Harris, the newly appointed commissioner of education, is the fact that he is an earnest tariff reformer and voted for President Cleveland last fall. If he shall accomplish anything in the way of educating the present administration in sound political economy, and in making clear to it the burdens which the protective tariff lays upon American manufactures and commerce, he may justify his occupancy of an office which in many respects is deemed an absurd feature in our form of government.

A glassware trust, including all the highly protected works in Pennsylvania, Ohio and West Virginia, is reported as among the latest combinations which result from the assurance that the policy of war taxes in time of peace is to be maintained. TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Will be Distributed.

SALEM, Aug. 22.—Senator Mitchell is in the city, talking with prominent republicans regarding prospective appointments. He has been interviewed by many friends of Hon. John W. Minto and Hon. A. N. Gilbert, candidates from Marion county for United States marshal. He says the five prominent offices in Oregon to be filled will probably be distributed over different sections of the state.

Enterprise.

MCMINNVILLE, Or., Aug. 22.—The contract for the water works and electric lighting of this city has been awarded to W. F. Garret & Co., of San Francisco.

The water is to be pumped from the Yamhill river by two Hall's compound duplex pumps, of 1,200,000 gallons capacity, run by two thirty horse power boilers, which also will run a Westinghouse engine and a five hundred light dynamo.

Beats Albany.

SPOKANE FALLS, W. T., Aug. 22.—S. G. Fulton, assistant general traffic manager of the N. P. R. R., authorizes the statement, that since August 5th, the day after the fire, 624 carloads of freight have been received at this point over that road. This represents nearly 10,000 tons aside from fifty six carloads of rails and iron for the Spokane Falls & Northern railroad. This was all merchandise, building materials and supplies.

Rebuilding Spokane.

SPOKANE FALLS, W. T., Aug. 22.—Goetz & Baer, owners of the Frankfurt block, which met the fate of all other fine brick blocks in the late fire, have leased fifty feet in width across the deep gulch in the rear of their present quarters on Riverside avenue for ten years and are building a high trestle, on which will extend a temporary building through the entire block, pending the restoration of the Frankfurt.

Drunk Men.

INDEPENDENCE, Ogn., Aug. 22.—Four drunken men were arrested here this evening. The marshal had two of them when the other two came up with clubs and endeavored to make him release them. The marshal knocked one of them down and with help lodged all four in jail.

LONDON, Aug. 22.—Mrs. Maybrick's sentence has been commuted to penal servitude for life.
