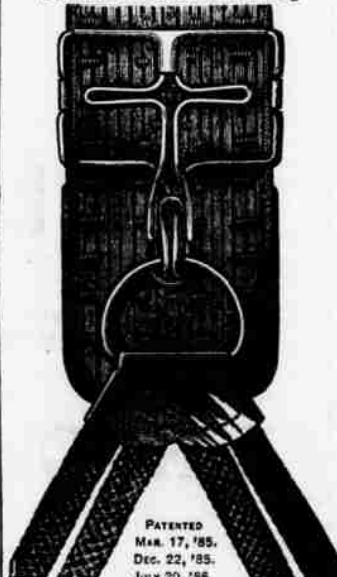

The platform of the Ohio Republicans is as
silent about civil service reform as that of their
Pennsylvania brethren is about the beneficial
effect of protection on Wages. Four years ago
the Ohio Republicans not only declared that
the party would maintain the law and aid in
amending it so far as necessary to give it full
force, but added that the party was "committed
to extend the law to all grades of service to
which it is applicable," and that "ample appro-
priations should be made to enforce it in letter
and spirit." Four years ago, however, there
was no change of embarrassing a Republican
administration by indiscreet enthusiasm for
civil service reform.

The colossal equestrian statue of General
Robert E Lee designed by Mercie of Paris is
now in the foundry, where it has been enlarged
section by section, from the life size model sup-
plied by the sculptor. It will probably reach
Richmond toward the end of November. The
pedestal is already in place. When unveiled
there will be grand ceremonies about the
statue, including a parade of military and of
veterans of the Confederate armies.

Worth, the famous man dressmaker of Paris
is a native born Englishman of striking appear-
ance, looking like a scotchman, and adding to
the likeness by wearing always a Scotch cap.
His father meant to make a printer of him, but
he didn't like the work and managed to get
into the dry goods trade in London. Thence
he went to Paris, where he found favor with
the Empress Eugenie, and his fortune was
made. He has a fine chateau near Paris.

There were 536 vessels of 919,611 tons gross
under construction in the United Kingdom at
the close of the quarter ended June 30. The
total number under construction at the same
period last year was 377, of an aggregate of
608,118 tons. Among the vessels under con-
struction 351 are steel steamers and 69 iron
steamers. The increase in the ship building
trade has been of similar proportions at all
the centers in the kingdom.

The G. A. R.

MILWAUKEE, Aug. 29.—At the morning
session of the national encampment, the elec-
tion of officers was completed. Dr Horace P
Porter, of Kansas, was chosen surgeon general;
W H Childers, of Kentucky, chaplain; I J
Lovett, of New Jersey, junior vice commander.
The encampment refuses to recognize the
sons of Veterans as auxiliary to the G A R,
because of a disturbing faction in the former.

A P M Dead.

SALEM, Aug. 29.—Postmaster R H Dear-
born died this afternoon at 5 o'clock. Mr
Dearborn was a most highly respected citizen,
beloved by all his neighbors. He was a pro-
nounced democrat, but republican are among
the sincerest mourners. He was born at Mad-
ison, Ind., in 1832; crossed the isthmus and
came to Oregon in 1853; settled at Roseburg,
where he married Helen A Flint in 1859. He
was the first clerk of Douglas county. He
came to Salem in 1864, and has been in the
mercantile business ever since. He was ap-
pointed postmaster last February, and had he
lived would have held through the term without
protest. He leaves a wife and five children.

Hop Picking.

INDEPENDENCE, Aug. 29.—Hop picking is
in full blast. O P Beardsley, of Eola, will
have over 50,000 pounds of hops, an increase
over last year of 10 per cent. He has 100
Chemawa Indians at work this week. Dove Bros.
will have 175 pickers at work this week, mostly
whites. They have eighty acres and four hop
houses.

Run Over.

SEATTLE, Aug. 29.—William Llewellyn, an
engine wiper, aged 25 years, was run over by
a Puget Sound Shore railroad train last night.
His injuries necessitated the amputation of
both legs, and his recovery is doubtful.

A Big Buy.

NEW YORK, Aug. 29.—There is a story on
Wall street that the Rockafellers have put up
\$5,000,000 to buy the Oregon & Transconti-
ental for Villard, and are now buying Northern
Pacific preferred in the same way.

A Stage Robbery.

RENO, Nev., Aug. 29.—The stage from Bid-
well, which arrived here last night, was stopped
by a highwayman, and Wells, Fargo & Co's
treasure box was stolen. The robber escaped
with his booty. The amount obtained is not
known.
