Thus is the increased wine production of California attended with an increased demand also for brandy, and accompanied by largely increased facilities for brandy making. Both mean, in the ultimate outcome, untold suffering and ruin in many an American home.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

An Electric Accident.
 SALEM, Or., Sept. 13.—Thomas Holman, proprietor of the Salem Electric Light Works, came very near being killed to-night about 10 o'clock. He undertook to fix an arc street light which was not burning well, and in some way caught hold of both wires, completing the circuit and receiving the full force of the dynamo. His cousin, Mrs. Victoria Lunn, was with him at the time, and when he was prostrated she took hold of him, trying to pull him away, when she too was shocked, and Mr. Holman, thinking he was going to be killed, begged her to let go, lest she be killed also. She released her hold of him and ran screaming for help to neighboring houses. Assistance arrived and succeeded in releasing him, when he was taken to the home of his cousin, John Holman, a block away. Medical assistance was sent for and Mr. Holman was found all right, except his hands, which were horribly burned inside.

The Strike Ended.
 LONDON, Sept. 13.—The Mansion house committee announced that the dock directors and men have practically agreed, and that as soon as the other interests have been arranged all the men will resume work, on the understanding that the deferred concessions will be granted in November.

Knives.
 PITTSBURG, Sept. 13.—A special from Huntington, W. Va., says: News has reached here of a terrible encounter among negroes at Bramwell, Mercer county. A number of colored miners had been drinking and engaged in a fight. Knives were drawn, and Dan Lambert and Tom Kadle were literally cut to pieces. Three of their companions were seriously, if not fatally, injured.

It Continues.
 NEW YORK, Sept. 13.—The signal officer says there will be no let up in the storm for the next twenty four hours. It is still general. Off the east coast of Virginia the wind has diminished to the south, but remains high along the coast. It had a velocity of thirty one miles in the city this morning; at Block Island forty two, Philadelphia thirty, Boston twenty two.

The Fireman's Tournament.
 TACOMA, Sept. 13.—The participants in the fireman's tournament, which will open in Tacoma next Monday, are already beginning to arrive. Two teams came in this morning on the steamer Premier, from Vancouver and New Westminster, B. C. The latter numbers sixteen men and the former twenty one. They are running teams, and a trim looking set of men.
