TELEGRAPHIC NEWS
A Collision.
SPOKANE FALLS, Wn., Sept. 20.—Defective air brakes caused a fatal collision this morning at Trent, nine miles east of this city. A passenger train was waiting there for the west bound freight, the engineer of which saw the headlight when a mile away, but having confidence in the air brakes ran some distance before applying them. Finding that they would not work he reversed his engine and whistled for hand brakes, slackening the speed to ten miles an hour, but he could not stop his train. The engineer of the passenger train perceived the danger and backed his train, but could not get out of the way. As the engine struck, Lou Hogan, a brakeman on the freight jumped and was caught by a car and almost instantly killed. A Hanigan, the engineer, was severely cut on the head. Ed Brennan, a laborer, stealing a ride on the platform of the baggage car, was injured on the head and internally. The injured men are at the hospital here.

DEER PARK, Sept. 20.—The commission-ship of pensions is still unsettled. President Harrison thinks Mayor Warner the best man for the place. He is expected here to-night for another conference, which the people about the president say will lead to his acceptance. General Lucius Fair child is mentioned, should Warner and Merrill decline.
A High Road.
MANTOU, Colo., Sept. 20.—The contract for building the cog wheel road up Pike's peak was signed yesterday at Chicago, and on Monday work will begin from the top of the peak. A force of 300 men will be set to work, and the road will be running by May, unless the winter is exceptionally severe.
The Tournament.
TACOMA, Wn., Sept. 20.—The last race of the Northwestern Firemen's tournament took place this morning. This was the hook and ladder contest. Only three teams entered, and Seattle won the first place in 29 1-5 seconds, Tacoma second, 32; Astoria third, 43 seconds. The Astoria team was shot handed.

MONTEREY, Cal., Sept. 20.—It is stated that young Fremman, son of John Fremman, of Salinas, while hunting deer in Carmel valley, 50 miles from here, discovered the works and workings of a mine that has been sought over a hundred years. The mine is said to be very rich in silver and gold quartz. A number of people are leaving for the scene of the reported discovery.
