TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Big Storm.

CHICAGO, Oct. 7.—Dispatches from several
points report a terrific storm on Lake Erie and
Huron to-day. Many schooners are believed
to have been lost, and it is feared that when
reports are all in there will be found many
sailors lost.

ROME, Oct. 6.—The province of Cagliari
has been ravaged by a terrific storm, in which
240 houses were destroyed, sixteen persons
killed and hundreds injured. The town of
Cagliari suffered severely.

LONDON, Oct. 6.—A terrible hurricane has
visited the island of Sardinia. One hundred
persons were buried in the debris of buildings
shattered by the storm, and thirty persons
were killed.

Lots of Killing.

ST ALBANS, W. Va., Oct. 7.—A bloody feud
is raging in Lincoln county between the Brum-
field and Hall families. Floyd Dingsess, son of
a justice of the peace and a prominent man
married one of the Hall girls. He quarreled
with his wife, and they separated. Next day
Dingsess and his wife's brother met. Dingsess
was shot dead. Alfred Brumfield married
Dingsess's sister. He swore to be avenged on
Hall, and he fatally wounded one of the Hall
brothers ten days ago. Brumfield and his wife
were waylaid and Mrs Brumfield shot dead.
Brumfield was terribly wounded two days later.
Floyd Brumfield was shot on Saturday, and
George Dingsess, a brother of Brumfield's wife,
was shot through the leg in a fight with one of
the opposing party.

Not Yet Settled.

OLYMPIA, Oct. 7.—Reimburse on the capital
question are now sufficiently complete to show
that Olympia came remarkably near gaining an
absolute victory. As it is, she far outstrips any
single competitor. In round numbers, 22,000
votes were cast for Olympia, against 12,000
for Yakima and 10,000 for Ellensburg, and
it is probable that this place would have won
had it not been for the casting of 1716 scattering
votes.

A Big Reward.

TACOMA, Oct. 7.—The citizens have sub-
scribed \$2500 reward for the arrest and convic-
tion of the man who shot young Crosby, and
the county commissioners have informally de-
cided to offer a similar amount, making in all
\$5000.

An Old Pistol.

MCMINNVILLE, Oct. 7.—Two little boys,
sons of J W Seelton, aged, living near Carlton,
were playing with an old pistol yesterday when
it was discharged, when in the hands of one of
them, shooting the other. The brother through
the head, killing him instantly.
