TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Fire Raging.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 18.—A dispatch to the *Examiner* from Bismarck, Dak., says: A prairie fire several miles in width is raging within a few miles of Bismarck. A large number of farms are already destroyed and all effort to check the flames have proved unavailing.

The village of Menoken fourteen miles below Bismarck has been entirely wiped out by the flames and the inhabitants are destitute. A strong wind is carrying the flames toward this city which is enveloped in smoke and flying cinders.

A Stage Held Up.

BAKER CITY, Oct. 18.—The Baker City and Canyon stage was held up at 6 o'clock this morning near Union creek, and the mail sacks robbed of all registered matter. The robber was disguised by having a dark woolen scarf tied over his head and face. The driver described the man as weighing about 135 pounds and that he dressed in dark clothes. After the robber had relieved the mail sacks of all registered matter, the other mail was replaced in the sacks and thrown in the stage and the driver ordered to proceed on his journey which he did without delay.

5 Cents Divides Them.

PARIS, Oct. 18.—The strikers in the Lens district now number 12,000, and it is likely that double this number of men will stop work unless the demands of the strikers are conceded. The directors of the mining companies have agreed to advance 5 per cent, increase of wages. The miners demand an increase of 10 per cent.

An Important Decision.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18.—Secretary Windom to-night made public his long expected lead ore decision, in which he sustains the present classification that admits a generous lead ore imported from Mexico free of duty.

Smugglers Captured.

PORT TOWNSEND, Oct. 18.—Richard Miller and Alfred Bodley were captured by customs officers to-day. Bowers and Peterson were near Irving park with \$300 worth of smuggled opium. Bodley is an old steambark employe, and the other also is an old offender. The men when arrested offered resistance.

Small Boys Did It.

KANSAS CITY, Oct. 18.—A large number of small incendiary fires have occurred recently. The police have discovered that the incendiaries were a band of school boys ranging in age from 11 to 15 years. They were regularly organized and called themselves Captain Kid's party. The leaders are under arrest.
