In Favor of Democrats.

HELENA, Oct. 31.—Judge De Wolf gave a
decision when the court met at 9:30 o'clock
this morning, wherein the celebrated manda-
mus case of John J. McFadden, democratic can-
didate for circuit judge was plaintiff and Jack
and Hall the canvassing board of Silver Bow
county were defendants. The mandamus was
for the purpose of preventing the county of the
vote for the disputed Tunnel district 34.
The judge ordered that a peremptory writ of
mandate be issued ordering Jack and Hall to
proceed forthwith to canvass the vote.

PENDLETON, Or., Oct. 31.—Recently a
sixteen child was born at Weston, who had
no eyeballs, the orifice where the eyes should
have appeared being but slightly marked.
Otherwise the infant has no peculiarity, is
lively and healthy.

Ran Over.

WALLA WALLA, Oct. 31.—On Wednesday
afternoon, while returning from school at Mil-
ton Or., Bonnie, a little daughter of M V B
Worthington, in company with other children,
attempted to crawl under a wagon loaded with
lumber standing across the sidewalk, just as
the driver started the team. She was imme-
diately knocked beneath the wheels, which
ran over the child's body at the waist and
caused injuries resulting in her death, which
occurred shortly after, in most intense agony.

Good for Manitoba.

ST PAUL, Minn., Oct. 31.—The Manitoba
road has been notified by the Union Pacific
that all joint tariffs, quoting through rates to
Portland, via Butte, will be at once withdrawn.
This effectively puts to rest all rumors of an
alliance between the two roads. This order is
an outcome of the Union Pacific Northwestern
deal. Similar action will be taken with the
lines connecting at Cheyenne and Denver.

Going for Outlaws.

LOUISVILLE, Oct. 31.—A special to the Cor-
rier Journal from Pineville, Ky., says: New
reached here to-night that Judge Lewis came
up with Howard yesterday and killed six of
them without losing a man. Judge Lewis de-
termined not to quit the case until Howard
and his gang were all killed or driven from the
country. Both parties are being reinforced
daily, and more bloodshed is expected. The
best of men of the county are joining Lewis's
forces.

The New States.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 31.—It is expected that
the proclamation admitting the two Dakotas
into the Union as states will be issued to-morrow.
The proclamation admitting Montana is de-
layed by the controversy in the territorial courts
over the controversy of a portion of the vote.
It is said that nothing has yet been received at
the White House indicating that an election
had been held in Washington, so there is no
information on which to base a proclamation
of statehood.
