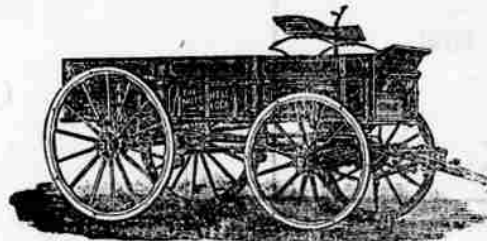

A Big Storm.

DENVER, Colo., Nov. 7.—A Republican special from Clayton, New Mexico, says: Unless the snow storm, which has been raging for eight days comes to an end soon, next summer will show a country covered with the dead bodies of animals as thickly as was the old Santa Fe trail in the sixties. The depth of the snow is not now less than 26 inches on a level and in many places it is drifted seven feet high. Nine miles below Clayton, two passenger trains have been southbound for a week. Provisions are running out and the passengers are compelled to venture out in the storm and kill cattle, the quarters of which are taken into the cars and roasted.

They Meet

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7.—Ex-President and Mrs. Cleveland, leaving the Bayard Clymer wedding this afternoon, drove over to the White House to pay their respects to President and Mrs. Harrison. On leaving later for New York, Mrs. Cleveland left her card and drove away. Mr. Cleveland alighted and was shown into the green parlor, where he was immediately joined by the president. They had a pleasant chat, during which the president made a good natured reference to the election, to which Mr. Cleveland answered in the same spirit.

Iowa.

DES MOINES, Nov. 7.—The additional returns on the legislative ticket show that the republican majority on a joint ballot will be eight thus insuring the re-election of Senator Allison. The Register, Rep., says: The revised figures give Boies, for governor, 4790 plurality, and indicate the probable election of all the republican state ticket except the governor.

RICHMOND, Nov. 7.—A tabulated statement of the vote of the state gives McKinney a majority of 41,000.

Should be Held.

SACRAMENTO, Nov. 5.—Several of the most prominent business men of this city have just held a meeting to consider the holding of an historical fair in 1792. The committee had been appointed and reported the progress of the work and a general acceptance of the idea as an excellent one. The committee concluded to call a mass meeting during the early part of December, when a prospectus will be prepared including the general plan of an exhibition. This fair is to be held in connection with the Pacific coast fair if the committee is successful in arranging the latter.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 5.—Rev Robert Mackenzie, pastor of the First Presbyterian church of this city, has received a call from the Dutch Reformed Church of New York city. The salary offered is said to be ten thousands dollars per annum.
