TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Business Now.

OLYMPIA, Nov. 20.—The legislative muddle has been settled. The governor has been inaugurated, the senators have been elected and the capital city has resumed its wonted placidity. Here and there a few flags and streamers of hunting flutter dimly in the moist November air and are but the remnants of the gayety attendant upon the setting of the machinery of state government in motion.

A Fatal Fire.

EUREKA, Cal., Nov. 20.—A fire occurred in a hotel in Arcata, eight miles from here yesterday morning. George A. Knight, of Neustadter Bros., San Francisco, and Tobias Bernhall were burned to death. Two ladies and several men were more or less injured or burned by leaping from the hotel windows. The fire originated in the hotel which was kept by Mrs. Waddle. Loss not less than \$30,000. Insurance less than \$5000.

Diphtheria.

MOORHEAD, Minn., Nov. 20.—A violent epidemic of diphtheria is raging in the villages of Middleton and Georgetown. Sixty five cases are now reported and a number of deaths have resulted. Both towns are quarantined.

Becoming Alarmed.

PARIS, Nov. 20.—A private telegram from Lisbon states that there is great excitement there over the Brazilian revolution. There is renewal of the fears of a republican uprising. The royal palace is guarded by troops for the first time since the death of the late king. The Portuguese minister, however, declares that the change in Brazil will have no serious effect in Portugal. The republicans are few and the soldiers loyal.

The Nicaragua Canal.

CHICAGO, Nov. 20.—C. P. Treat, a large stockholder in the Nicaragua Canal Company, who is now here says: "I have just received news from Nicaragua, that the preparatory work on the canal is being pushed as rapidly as is possible. The first trouble with which we met, is the difficulty in landing ships at Greytown. We are working with every energy and are now building breakwater and docks."

Stanley Approaching.

BERLIN, Nov. 20.—The *Reichs Anzeiger* publishes a dispatch from Captain Weissman, dated October 13, saying that four of Stanley's soldiers and one of Emin's men had arrived there. They left Stanley at Neukuma, August 10, Emin and Casati had with them 300 Soudanese soldiers and a large number of people conveying a great quantity of ivory. Stanley was bringing 240 Zanzibars and six lieutenants.
